#### Call to Order

The Rock Valley College (RVC) Board of Trustees Committee of the Whole meeting convened on Tuesday, September 9, 2025, in the Performing Arts Room (PAR, Room 0214) in the Educational Resource Center (ERC). The meeting was called to order at 5:15 p.m. by Chairman Paul Gorski.

#### **General Presentations**

There were no general presentations.

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#### Teaching, Learning & Communications Discussion: Board Liaison Trustee Goldsmith

#### 1. FY2025 Enrollment Update

Ms. Heather Snider, vice president of institutional effectiveness and communications, presented the FY2026 Enrollment Update. Ms. Snider stated that not much has changed with the Fall semester enrollment because census day was September 3, 2025. RVC is about 5% above the FY2026 budget and 1% above the stretch goal. Ms. Snider said that the combined enrollment for Summer II and Fall is 7% above the budget and 3% above the stretch goal. Discussion ensued.

#### 2. Strategic Plan Update: Caring Campus Rollout Plan

Dr. Amanda Smith, vice president of academic affairs, presented the Strategic Plan Update: Caring Campus Rollout Plan. Dr. Smith explained that Caring Campus is an initiative that identifies commitments to common behaviors that faculty and adjuncts can employ in their classrooms to foster a sense of connectedness. Caring Campus was rolled out to faculty at the Fall Professional Development Day and will continue throughout the year, with faculty adding to the repository of activities that demonstrate the Caring Campus behavioral commitments. Dr. Smith presented a five-minute video that the faculty compiled regarding Caring Campus.

#### **Dual and Articulated Credit Memoranda of Understanding**

**Early College Items:** As an introduction to the Early College items on the agenda, Dr. Stewart provided an overview of the Dual and Articulated Credit and Running Start programs, as well as agreements with the area high school districts.

To provide consistency across school districts and align with the Dual Credit Quality Act, RVC developed the Dual and Articulated Credit Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) that offers dual credit for high school courses. These dual credit courses, taught by qualified high school instructors, are designed to allow eligible students to earn college credit while still in high school.

Running Start is a formal program that allows qualified students to attend RVC for their junior and senior high school years. Students may enroll in a two-year degree completion program, which will enable them to take courses that meet the requirements for both a high school diploma and an RVC associate degree simultaneously. Alternatively, they may enroll in a one-year program that meets the requirements for both a high school diploma and one year of RVC credit courses simultaneously. The Running Start program is administered through the Early College office at RVC in conjunction with the high schools enrolled in the program.

Trustee Nelson asked Dr. Stewart for the enrollment for the Dual and Articulated Credit program with Rockford Public Schools District #205 (RPS #205). Dr. Stewart answered that 687 students were utilizing the Dual and Articulated Credit program. Trustee Trojan inquired about the Running Start program, and Dr. Stewart responded that 18 students are enrolled in the program, as the district determines the number of students who can utilize it. Trustee Gorski wanted to know why there was a cap of 20 students for the Running Start program. Dr. Stewart stated that each school district chooses how many students will be allowed to participate in the Running Start program due to cost, and districts may not have the staff who are qualified to teach college courses. Trustee Cardenas Cudia would like to know the demographics of the students who participate in the Dual and Articulated Credit and Running

Start programs. Trustee Trojan would like to see a table at the Annual Career Expo to promote RVC, and it would be a great selling point for RVC.

Trustee Nelson had questions regarding Purchase Report A, Item B. He wanted to know if the final cost for the Ellucian services was \$1,300,000 or \$1,353,000. Ms. Kerr responded that the \$53,000 was carried over from FY2025. Trustee Nelson requested the original approved amount, and Ms. Kerr stated that she did not have that amount available at this time but would be happy to provide it at a later time. Trustee Gorski would like the total project cost over the two fiscal years brought to the next meeting for clarification. Discussion ensued.

Discussion ensued on Purchase Report B, Item F, H, I, and J.

Ms. Kerr stated that at the Regular Board meeting, Purchase Report B will include a redlined version adding Item K, for Airgas USA in the amount of \$29,002.52. Item K is for the purchase of two used Lincoln Electric Power Wave 300C welders. Discussion ensued.

#### 2. Cash and Investment Report

Ms. Lori Mack, executive director of finance, presented the Cash and Investment Report through August 31, 2025. Total operating cash is \$34,579,840. Total operating cash and investments are \$102,521,697. The operating cash and investments have changed by <\$3,756,746> since July 31, 2025. Total capital funds are \$84,522,519. Since July 31, 2025, the change in capital funds has been \$2,337,122. Ms. Mack stated that the total operating cash and investment funds were 95.42% of the FY2026 operating budget. Discussion ensued.

#### **Operations Discussion: Board Liaison Trustee Trojan**

# 1. Board Policy Manual Update: Article 2-Operations (First Reading)

Dr. Terrica Huntley, vice president of human resources, introduced the first reading of the Board Policy Manual Update: Article 2-Operations. Dr. Huntley explained that Robbins Schwartz attorneys perform an initial review of the Board Policies to ensure all policies are in compliance with current legal standards. Ms. Ann Kerwitz, assistant to the president, and Dr. Huntley have been reviewing the proposed document changes with appropriate leaders from respective functional areas to ensure institutional congruity. The proposed changes have been reviewed multiple times by each entity, and the necessary administrative procedures have been updated or created as applicable. It is recommended to add two new policies, the Drug Free Schools and Communities Act Policy and the Non-Discrimination and Anti-Harassment Policy. In addition, three policies will be moved from Article 3-Human Resources to Article 2-Operations. Several other policies have been updated to comply with legal acts, state law enforcement policies, and the Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) guidelines for general safety operations, procurement, and technology.

Trustee Nelson commented that he did not have enough time to review the changes; however, Trustee Trojan explained that trustees have at least two months due to the two readings. Trustees are encouraged to review the document and submit any questions and comments to the president's office. If additional time is needed for that review, the date for the vote for the Second Reading can be extended.

Board Chair Gorski commented that he remembered about a year ago that Trustee Crystal Soltow had volunteered to serve as a liaison to the Board Policy Manual review committee, but he did not know

her level of participation and would check the meeting minutes to confirm. He added if there is not a trustee involved in the policy review, he does not want to hold up the process.

### 2. Rock Valley College Events Calendar

Vice President Huntley reviewed the RVC Events Calendar, highlighting the Massage Therapy Graduation scheduled for tomorrow, September 10, 2025, in the Stenstrom Student Center Atrium at 11:30 a.m. Additionally, Dr. Huntley mentioned the Tom Lombardo Tree Dedication and the Starlight Shakespeare productions. On October 1, 2025, at 6:00 p.m., RVC will host the Illinois Association for College Admission Counseling (IACAC) College Night in the Physical Education Center gym. Discussion ensued.

Trustee Trojan added that he appreciated hearing the personal story of Bing Liu, keynote speaker and RVC graduate.
  - Employees were celebrated for their employment duration, especially Sharla Parsons, research associate in the Institutional Research and Effectiveness Department, for her 40 years of service as an RVC employee.
  - Ryan Russell, former student trustee and current trade grant recruiter, received the Rookie of the Year Award.
  - o Rhonda Hutter, academic program specialist, was named Employee of the Year.
  - o Brittany Freiberg, RVC Foundation chief development officer, was named Leader of the Year.
  - Professor Martin Quirk commented in a message to Dr. Spearman that in his 27 years, he has seen few semesters that have started this smoothly, and he is very proud to be part of RVC.
- Rockford Mayor McNamara is leading a series of OpEds in the Rockford Register Star highlighting the community's great progress in education over the past few years. His editorial will be followed by Rockford Public Schools, Rockford University and Rock Valley College.

   3) College Night will be held October 1 from 6:00-8:00 p.m. in the Physical Education Center. Over 120 colleges and universities will be on campus. Marketing for the event is done by RVC and the state coordinator group.

- Dr. Terrica Huntley described how the HR Roadshow is meeting with employee groups to increase communication and explain the various functions of the Human Resources Department and how they support employees. The team will meet with 15 departmental groups this fall and then offer the same opportunity to other groups next year.
- Heather Snider announced that enrollment is mostly secure. As of this week, enrollment for fall is 4% ahead of last year, 5% ahead of budget, and 1% ahead of the stretch goal. When combined with summer II, FY2026 credit-hour enrollment is 6% ahead of last year, 7% ahead of budget, and 3% ahead of the stretch goal.
- Dr. Hansen Stewart invited trustees to attend the Manufacturing Day celebration to be held from 8:00-1:00 at the Advanced Technology Center (ATC) on October 9.
   Approximately 325 to 400 students from 12 area high school districts are expected to attend. RVC is hosting the event in conjunction with CEANCI and area manufacturers who will provide exhibits. CEANCI is handling the marketing, while RVC is coordinating the morning press conference.
- Rick Jenks provided updates on several projects. 1) The renovations to the Health Sciences Center are nearing completion and items on the final punch list with the construction contractor are minor. The move-in date is expected the end of October or early November. The elevator shaft is under construction, and the elevator is on site. The project should be completed before the Christmas break 2) The Classroom Building II (CLII) architects are meeting with departments for program review. The project completion is scheduled for July 2028. 3) Repair of the turret on the Stenstrom Student Center (SCC) bridge is out for bid with a deadline of October 3. The estimated cost is \$160,000 \$210,000. 4) Parts to complete the HVAC repairs in the Jacobs Center for Science and Math (JCSM) are expected October 20, and the College is working on date for installation. 5) The new boiler is expected to arrive mid-October, with final demo and installation in November.
- Dr. Amanda Smith reported that the Dental Hygiene program recently had its site visit from the Commission on Dental Accreditation. Two peer reviewers visited campus to meet with faculty and students and to explore the program. They were especially impressed with the Dental Hygiene Clinic facility. She also thanked Dr. Marie Navickis, the program chair, for her preparatory work related to the visit.

#### 3. Illinois Community College Trustee Association (ICCTA) Report

Trustee Nelson did not have a report, however, he announced that RVC will be hosting a meeting of the ICCTA Northwest Region on November 6 at the Aviation Career Education Center (ACEC). The agenda will feature the Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) Executive Director Brian Durham, ICCTA Executive Director Jim Reed, and a cyber security presentation by RVC Board Chair Paul Gorski. Dr. Spearman added that tours of the AAR facility will be available at 4:00 p.m., with the meeting and dinner to begin at 5:00 p.m.

#### 4. Student Trustee Report

Student Trustee Isiah Blake provided an update on recent student activities including Welcome Week, Student Government Association, What's the Tea Tuesday, InterVarsity, Black Student Union (BSU), and his overall student engagement observations. He added that Dr. Spearman, Dr. Hansen Stewart, and Dr. Terrica Huntley attend the BSU cookout that included black students from the community. On September 19, he attended the Illinois Community College Student Activities Association (ICCSAA) meeting held at Lake Land College, where he met with other student trustees about how they serve in their roles as student trustee. He ran for and was elected secretary for the group.

#### 5. Trustee Comments

- Board Chair Paul Gorski reminded everyone that the October 14 Committee of the Whole meeting will be held at the Advanced Technology Center in Belvidere.
- Trustee Crystal Soltow had no comments.
- Trustee Gloria Cardenas Cudia questioned why the Board meetings are not on the events calendar that is distributed with the Committee of the Whole packets. Staff confirmed that the events calendar is not a complete listing of events, and the Board meeting schedule is posted for the public on the RVC website.
- Trustee Bob Trojan commented that Rockford Public Schools #205 is almost ready to open their College and Career Education Center at the former RVC Samuelson Road location in late October or early November. He thought the College should request an invitation, as this may be a pathway for RVC future students. He also asked if the Board received an invitation to the RPS Superintendent Search community input session scheduled for September 30 or October 1.
- Trustee John Nelson described his recent motorcycle trip on the Great River Road last week. He stopped in Nelson, Wisconsin and bought a T-shirt.
- Board Chair Paul Gorski thanked the estimated 50-60 people who watch on live stream and for being part of the larger RVC community.

## 6. RVC Foundation Report

Trustee Trojan provided an update on the RVC Foundation.

- The Foundation has secured commitments for \$2.5 million for the Downtown West fundraising effort.
- The Foundation Board has approved \$500,000 for naming rights to the three athletic fields being converted to artificial turf.
- Of the \$874,900 available for scholarships, \$700,000 was awarded to 405 applicants. Nearly \$170,000 was not awarded due to lack of applicants or not meeting award criteria.
- The Golden Eagles Family Breakfast will be held on Thursday, October 16 at 8:00 a.m. in the Stenstrom Student Center Atrium. The theme is centered around RVC Foundation scholarships and the impact those funds have on students.
- The Scholarship Recipient Luncheon will be held November 7 at the Radisson Conference Center. Trustees encouraged to attend.
- The second CEO Challenge has been scheduled for April 2026. The fundraising goal will be \$100,000.

Board Chair Gorski requested a report on why all scholarship funds are not given away and what is done to advertise the availability of scholarship funds. Trustee Trojan responded that some scholarships have specific requirements such as GPA. Dr. Spearman added that he and Brittany Freiberg, chief development officer, are working with some donors to adjust the required GPA for the scholarships and that Ms. Freiberg will address this in a presentation at the October Committee of the Whole.

#### 7. Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) Report

The FOIA report was accepted as presented.

#### **Next Meeting**

The next Committee of the Whole meeting will be held on October 14, 2025, in Room 1300 of the Advanced Technology Center, 1400 Big Thunder Blvd, Belvidere, IL. *Location is for this meeting only*.

The next Regular Meeting will be held on October 28, 2025, in the Performing Arts Room (PAR, Room 0214) located in the Educational Resources Center (ERC) on the main campus.

At 7:10 p.m., a motion was made by Trustee Nelson, seconded by Trustee Cudia, to adjourn the Regular meeting. The motion was approved by unanimous roll call vote.

II. The corporate and special purpose property taxes extended or abated for 2024 were \$26,978,854.

The proposed corporate and special purpose property taxes to be levied for 2025 are \$29,673,777.

This represents an **increase** of 9.99% from the previous year.

III. The property taxes extended for debt service and public building commission leases for 2024 were \$14,496,317.

The property taxes to be levied for debt service and public building commission leases for 2025 are \$14,495,501. This represents a **decrease** of 0.01% from the previous year.

IV. The total property taxes extended or abated for 2024 were \$41,475,171.

The estimated total property taxes to be levied for 2025 are \$44,169,278. This represents an **increase** of 6.50% from the previous year.

#### Update to Rock Valley College Board Policy Manual Article 2-Operations Second Reading

#### **Background:**

The purpose of the Rock Valley College Board Policy Manual is to document the rules and regulations applicable to the operations of Rock Valley College and to ensure compliance with applicable laws and regulations.

During the April 23, 2024, Reorganization Meeting concerning Adoption of Policies of the Board, extensive discussion took place regarding the need to review and update the current Board Policy Manual. Rather than approve the current Board Policy Manual, the trustees approved a motion to adopt the current Board Policies for a period not to exceed 90 days. During this period, Trustees Nelson and Gorski will review the policies and prepare them for presentation to the College Attorney and President Spearman, prior to review by the Board of Trustees.

As a result of discussion at the June 11, 2024, Committee of the Whole meeting, Board Report #8165 was approved at the June 25, 2024, Regular Board of Trustees meeting to adopt the current Board Policy Manual (Policies of the Board) as presented on April 23, 2024, with revisions to be made on a section-by-section basis until the Board Policy Manual is fully updated.

On September 24, 2024, Board Report #8204, Article 1-Board of Trustees Bylaws of the Board Policy Manual, as reviewed and revised by Robbins Schwartz attorneys and College Administration, was adopted by the Board of Trustees.

Since then, College personnel, including vice presidents, deans, directors, executive directors, and staff, have been working with attorneys from Robbins Schwartz to update Article 2-Operations with regard to law, safety, and policy. Proposed changes were reviewed several times by each entity, and the appropriate administrative procedures were updated or created where applicable.

# Abused and Neglected Child Reporting; Minors on Campus

The Board of Trustees recognizes the obligations set forth in the Abused and Neglected Child Reporting Act ("ANCRA") (325 ILCS 5/1 et seq.) and Article II of the Juvenile Court Act of 1987 ("JCA") (705 ILCS 405/2-1 et seq.).

**Mandated Reporters:** ANCRA provides that all personnel of institutions of higher education are mandated reporters. 325 ILCS 5/4. Mandated reporters are required to immediately report to the Department of Children and Family Services ("DCFS") whenever there is **reasonable cause** to believe that a child with whom they have contact in their professional capacity may be **abused or neglected**.

Students enrolled in an academic program leading to a position as a child care worker, school service personnel, and/or education degree, as well as medical personnel, including but not limited to residents and interns, are also mandated reporters pursuant to ANCRA.

**Cooperation:** Employees and students are required to cooperate in the investigation of any report made pursuant to ANCRA.

**Immunity for Good Faith Reports:** ANCRA provides immunity for anyone who makes a report in good faith.

**No Retaliation:** Retaliation against any employee, student, volunteer, or other individuals who makes a good faith report of abuse or neglect or who participates in any investigation of abuse or neglect under ANCRA is prohibited. Anyone found to have engaged in prohibited retaliation may be subject to discipline, up to and including termination, expulsion, and/or other sanctions.

Procedures to implement this policy will be published through the College's Human Resources Department and made available in that office, the Student Affairs office, and the College's website.

Minors on Campus: The College recognizes that minors may accompany adults during visits to campus. Rock Valley College's practice is to be respectful and supportive of the families and children of students, employees, and visitors. As an institution of higher education, the College provides educational and support services primarily to adult learners, although a variety of activities, classes, and programs are offered to minors. The College is a public institution, available to its students and the general public who may wish to use its facilities, learn about its services and programs, or attend functions on the campus. The general public has the right to use the College's facilities and to visit the College during normal hours of operation.

In general, the College does not supervise minors outside of officially sanctioned programs and activities, and neither the College, nor its employees, agents, or students may accept responsibility to do so on behalf of the College. The College accepts neither responsibility, nor liability for accidents or injuries that may occur to a non-enrolled minor while on campus.

Responsibility and liability lie completely with the minor's parent or responsible adult.

Minors shall not be present at an employee's workplace or accompany a student to his/her classes (e.g., office, classroom, labs, etc.) in lieu of other childcare arrangements. Exceptions may be granted by the College President or appropriate vice president for College planned special events.

No student, employee, or visitor to the College shall leave a minor unattended at the College, including outside of classrooms where a parent or accompanying adult is attending an activity at the College, in campus buildings, on campus grounds, or in a vehicle.

Unattended minors who are on campus without a parent or accompanying adult may be asked by Rock Valley College Police to leave; may be referred to the Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS); or may be referred to the local police, depending upon the circumstances (e.g., child's age, address, behavior, etc.).

### **RVC Board Policy 2:10.035**

### **Prohibiting Sex-Based Misconduct**

#### I. Policy Statement

Rock Valley College is committed to maintaining a safe and healthy educational and employment environment that is free from discrimination, harassment and other misconduct on the basis of sex, which includes sexual orientation, gender-related identity and expression, pregnancy, and other protected characteristics related to sex under federal, state, or local law. The College prohibits all forms of sex-based misconduct, including, but not limited to, sex discrimination, sexual harassment, sexual violence, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking. The College also prohibits discrimination and harassment on the basis of protected characteristics under its under its Non-Discrimination-Students Policy and Equal Employment Opportunity Policy.

It is the policy of the College to comply with Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 ("Title IX"), the Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act ("VAWA"), Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 ("Title VII"), the Illinois Human Rights Act, the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act ("Clery Act"), the Preventing Sexual Violence in Higher Education Act, and all other applicable laws and local ordinances regarding unlawful sex-based discrimination, harassment or other misconduct.

Employees or students found to have engaged in prohibited misconduct will be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including termination and/or expulsion from the College. Contractors, visitors, and any other third parties found to have engaged in prohibited misconduct will be addressed in accordance with the authority of the College in the context of the relationship of the third-party to the College.

#### II. Title IX Compliance

As required under Title IX and its implementing regulations, the College does not discriminate on the basis of sex and prohibits sex discrimination in the education programs and activities that it operates. This requirement not to discriminate extends to admission and employment.

The College has designated the Dean of Students and Executive Director of Human Resources as the Title IX Coordinator(s), who are responsible for coordinating the College's efforts to comply with its responsibilities under Title IX. Inquiries about the application of Title IX and 34 C.F.R. Part 106 may be directed to the College's Title IX Coordinator(s), the Assistant Secretary for Civil Rights at the United States Department of Education, or both.

#### III. Retaliation Prohibited

Retaliation, including intimidation, threats, coercion, adverse educational or employment actions, or discrimination against any person because they have, in good faith, reported or disclosed alleged discrimination, filed a complaint, or otherwise participated or declined to participate in an investigation into allegations of discrimination, is strictly prohibited.

#### IV. Implementing Procedures

The College will establish, maintain and publish procedures implementing this Policy, which set forth:

- The application and scope of the College's prohibition on sex-based misconduct;
- Definitions of prohibited conduct and a definition of consent;
- Responsibilities of and contact information for the College's Title IX Coordinator(s) and Department of Human Resources;
- Rights and options for assistance by the College, law enforcement, a medical facility, or a crisis center following an incident of sex-based misconduct;
- Procedures for reporting and confidentially disclosing alleged sex-based misconduct, including a mechanism for reporting and independent review of allegations against an elected official by;
- Responsibilities of College employees with regard to reporting, forwarding, and/or keeping confidential allegations of discrimination, as applicable;
- The College's response to reports of alleged sex-based misconduct;
- The College's grievance process for complaints alleging Title IX sexual harassment and/or alleging sexual violence, domestic violence, dating violence, or stalking;
- Potential sanctions that may be imposed following the implementation of the College's grievance procedures and limits on those sanctions;
- Prevention and education programming provided to College students; and
- Training and education provided to the Title IX Coordinator(s), Department of Human Resources, campus law enforcement, Responsible Employees and anyone else involved in the receipt of reports of, responding to, investigating or adjudicating alleged incidents of sexual discrimination, harassment or other sex-based misconduct, or involved in the referral or provision of services to survivors.

As of January 1, 2012, the Illinois Sex Offender Registration Act, 730 ILCS 150/1 et seq., requires that any sex offender or sexual predator that will be employed at or enrolled in classes at higher education institutions must register with the campus police.

### **Identity Theft Protection**

Rock Valley College Board of Trustees authorizes the Administration to implement an Identity Theft Prevention Program in compliance with the Fair and Accurate Credit Transactions Act of 2003: 16 C.F.R. Part 681 (Federal Trade Commission Rule) and to implement policies to comply with the Safeguards Rule: 16 CFR Part 314.

The purpose of this Identity Theft Prevention Program is to detect the warning signs - or "red flags" - of identity theft in our day-to-day operations, take steps to prevent the crime, and mitigate the damage it inflicts. This Program establishes reasonable policies and procedures to facilitate the identification, detection, and response of identity theft in connection with new and established Covered Accounts.

The Federal Trade Commission's Red Flags Rule apply to creditors, including the College based on the College's offering of institutional loans to students and a plan for payment of tuition, , and the Red Flag Rules impose obligation on those creditors that maintain Covered Accounts, specifically the obligation to maintain a written Identity Theft Prevention Program. A Covered Account, under the Red Flags Rule, is basically a consumer account that involves multiple payments or transactions, such as a loan that is billed or payable monthly. The term Covered Account is also other accounts where there is a reasonably foreseeable risk to consumers or the safety and soundness of the credit from identity theft.

The Program applies to the creation, modification and access to Identifying Information of customers to the College. This Program does not replace or repeal any previously existing policies or programs addressing some or all of the activities that are the subject of this Program. This Program acts as a supplement to existing policies and programs.

# RVC Board Policy 2:10.095 Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act Policy

#### I. Policy Statement

Rock Valley College is committed to maintaining a safe and healthy work environment for all students, employees, and community members. In compliance with the requirements of the federal Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988 and the federal Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act Amendments of 1989, the College has enacted and maintains a drug-free campus policy.

It is the policy of the College that the use, possession, distribution, manufacture, or sale of, or intoxication by illegal drugs, cannabis or its derivatives, controlled substances, unauthorized prescription drugs, or alcoholic beverages (unless authorized as set forth herein) on the premises of any College building or facility, in College-owned vehicles, during work or school hours or while attending any College-related activity is hereby prohibited. Exceptions for alcoholic beverages for special events must be approved by the College's President and in accordance with the Illinois Liquor Control Act of 1934 and any applicable local ordinances.

For purposes of this policy, the terms "controlled substances" or "drugs" shall be defined as the term "controlled substances" is defined in Schedules I through V of Section 202 of the Federal Controlled Substances Act (21 USC § 812).

#### II. Prohibited Conduct

The use, possession, distribution, manufacture, or sale of illegal drugs, cannabis or its derivatives, controlled substances, unauthorized prescription drugs or alcoholic beverages (unless authorized as set forth herein) by students and employees on College property or while participating in any of its activities is prohibited. Faculty, staff, students, and visitors are also prohibited from being under the influence of illegal drugs, cannabis or its derivatives, controlled substances, unauthorized prescription drugs, or alcohol (unless authorized as set forth herein) on the premises of any College building or facility, in College-owned vehicles, while on call, or otherwise during work or school hours, regardless of when and/or where the use occurred.

#### III. Disciplinary Sanctions

Any student or employee who violates this Policy is subject to all applicable Rock Valley College disciplinary sanctions as outlined in the Student Code of Conduct and/or the Employee Handbook. Any community member who violates this Policy will be subject to removal from the College property or event and may be referred to the appropriate law enforcement agency.

#### IV. Drug and Alcohol Abuse Prevention Program

Rock Valley College shall develop and implement a program to educate students and employees on dangers associated with the use of illegal drugs, controlled substances, cannabis and its derivatives, and alcohol. Procedures shall be established to prevent the

use, possession, distribution, manufacture, and sale of illegal drugs, controlled substances, cannabis and its derivatives, and alcohol by students, employees, and visitors.

#### V. Compassionate Use of Medical Cannabis Program Act

In compliance with the Compassionate Use of Medical Cannabis Program Act, the College will not discriminate against any person based solely on their status as a registered qualifying patient. The College will enforce its drug -free workplace policies in a non-discriminatory manner. Notwithstanding the foregoing, this policy prohibits the use or possession of medically prescribed cannabis in the workplace and on campus, and/or being under the influence of cannabis, as a qualifying patient under the Illinois Compassionate Use of Medical Cannabis Program Act during the workday, on College property, in College-owned vehicles, and while participating in College-sponsored activities.

Non-discrimination includes making reasonable accommodations in accordance with applicable College procedures. Rock Valley College will endeavor, in compliance with state and federal law, to make such reasonable accommodations, unless those accommodations fundamentally alter the nature of the service, program, or activity, or would place an undue hardship on the College.

Rock Valley College prohibits retaliation against any individual who reports concerns regarding discrimination on the basis of disability, who cooperates with or participates in any investigation of allegations of disability discrimination, or any individual who is perceived to have engaged in any of these actions.

Rock Valley College understands that a welcoming environment for students, employees, and the community is fundamental to achieving its mission. Therefore, Rock Valley College is committed to building and maintaining a community that improves opportunities for all, including all qualified individuals with disabilities. This commitment is an expectation of our College's shared values, consistent with an intellectual community that celebrates individual differences.

Rock Valley College will establish procedures for employees, students, facilities, and technology regarding compliance with the ADA and other applicable state and federal laws, including information on submitting requests for accommodations.

The Rock Valley College Police Department ("Police Department") is created in accordance with the Illinois Public Community College Act, 110 ILCS 805/3-42.1. The officers of the Police Department are peace officers in accordance with the Act. Therefore, they are granted the same authority as police officers in cities and sheriffs in counties, including the power to make arrests on view or warrants of violations of State statutes and city or county ordinances.

The Police Department provides service, assistance and protection of life and property, enforces the laws of the State of Illinois, and cooperates with and assists local law enforcement agencies in accordance with applicable statutes and mutual aid agreements.

The Police Department shall maintain a procedure manual which reflects current best practices and model procedures within the law enforcement profession. Officers shall be authorized to carry weapons, including firearms. All members of the Police Department shall receive training and maintain certification in accordance with applicable statutes.

  - A. Four-inch strip (or width of glass if less than 4 inches wide), from top to bottom, shall be clear of coverings of any type.
  - B. Remainder of upper glass pane may be covered with posters, curtains, etc., providing the covering is approved by the Divisional Vice President.
- II. Lower glass pane in two-pane doors: no coverings of any type shall be permitted.
- III. Any variation must allow clear view into an office and must be approved by the Divisional Vice President.
- IV. No coverings of any type shall be permitted on exterior glass panes of offices.

The Administration, in consultation with the College Police Department, shall develop procedures outlining the circumstances under which a visitor's access to or presence on College property may be restricted, and the process for issuing a notrespass order to such visitor for a definite period of time, to be determined on a case-by-case basis.

Nothing in this Policy precludes the College from issuing a no trespass directive to a currently enrolled student pursuant to the College's existing policies and procedures governing students, including but not limited to the Student Code of Conduct and the Code of Conduct for Visitors and Guests.

#### Service and Other Animals Policy

It is the policy of Rock Valley College to ensure that all individuals with disabilities who require the assistance of a service animal have an equal opportunity to access College property, courses, programs, and activities. The College Administration shall establish Procedures implementing this Policy.

Except as set forth in the Procedures implementing this Policy, service animals will be permitted to accompany individuals with disabilities in all public areas of the College. For purposes of this Policy, "service animal" is defined as set forth in the Americans with Disabilities Act ("ADA"). The support provided by the service animal must be directly related to the individual's disability. Service animals whose sole function is to provide comfort or emotional support do not qualify as service animals under this Policy.

Service animals must be under the control of the handler at all times. Service animals must be harnessed, leashed, or tethered, unless the individual's disability prevents the use of these devices or unless these devices interfere with the service animal's safe and effective performance of the tasks it has been trained to perform. In such cases, the individual must still maintain control of the service animal by means of voice, signal, or other effective controls.

Students in need of a service animal on campus must contact Disability Support Services to request and manage their accommodations, including the need for a service animal on campus. Employees in need of a service animal on campus must contact Human Resources to request a reasonable accommodation allowing the presence of a service animal in the workplace.

Animals that do not satisfy the above criteria are strictly prohibited from all Rock Valley College property.

The College reserves the right to remove and/or exclude any service animal from College property for legitimate and legally permissible public health or safety reasons.

In implementing this Policy, Rock Valley College complies with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA), the Americans with Disabilities Amendments Act of 2008 (ADAAA), Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, the Service Animal Access Act/White Cane Law, and all other federal and State laws pertaining to service animals and/or accommodations for individuals with disabilities.

# Abused and Neglected Child Reporting; Minors on Campus

The Board of Trustees recognizes the obligations set forth in the Abused and Neglected Child Reporting Act ("ANCRA") (325 ILCS 5/1 et seq.) and Article II of the Juvenile Court Act of 1987 ("JCA") (705 ILCS 405/2-1 et seq.).

**Mandated Reporters:** ANCRA provides that all personnel of institutions of higher education are mandated reporters. 325 ILCS 5/4. Mandated reporters are required to immediately report to the Department of Children and Family Services ("DCFS") whenever there is **reasonable cause** to believe that a child with whom they have contact in their professional capacity may be **abused or neglected**.

Students enrolled in an academic program leading to a position as a child\_care worker, school service personnel, and/or education degree, as well as medical personnel, including but not limited to residents and interns, are also mandated reporters pursuant to ANCRA.

**Cooperation:** Employees and students are required to cooperate in the investigation of any report made pursuant to ANCRA.

**Immunity for Good Faith Reports:** ANCRA provides immunity for anyone who makes a report in good faith.

**No Retaliation:** Retaliation against any employee, student, volunteer, or other individuals who makes a good faith report of abuse or neglect or who participates in any investigation of abuse or neglect under ANCRA is prohibited. Anyone found to have engaged in prohibited retaliation may be subject to discipline, up to and including termination, expulsion, and/or other sanctions.

Procedures to implement this policy will be published through the College's Human Resources Department and made available in that office, the Student Affairs office, and the College's website.

**Minors on Campus:** The College recognizes that minors may accompany adults during visits to campus. Rock Valley College's practice is to be respectful and supportive of the families and children of students, employees, and visitors. As an institution of higher education, the College provides educational and support services primarily to adult learners, although a variety of activities, classes, and programs are offered to minors. The College is a public institution, available to its students and the general public who may wish to use its facilities, learn about its services and programs, or attend functions on the campus. The general public has the right to use the College's facilities and to visit the College during normal hours of operation.

In general, the College does not supervise minors outside of officially sanctioned programs and activities, and neither the College, nor its employees, agents, or students may accept responsibility to do so on behalf of the College. The College accepts neither responsibility, nor liability for accidents or injuries that may occur to a non-enrolled minor while on campus.

Responsibility and liability lie completely with the minor's parent or responsible adult.

Minors shall not be present at an employee's workplace or accompany a student to his/her classes (e.g., office, classroom, labs, etc.) in lieu of other childcare arrangements. Exceptions may be granted by the College President or appropriate vice president for College planned special events.

No student, employee, or visitor to the College shall leave a minor unattended at the College, including outside of classrooms where a parent or accompanying adult is attending an activity at the College, in campus buildings, on campus grounds, or in a vehicle

Unattended minors who are on campus without a parent or accompanying adult may be asked by Rock Valley College Police to leave; may be referred to the Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS); or may be referred to the local police, depending upon the circumstances (e.g., child's age, address, behavior, etc.).

#### **Prohibiting Sex-Based Misconduct**

#### I. Policy Statement

Rock Valley College is committed to maintaining a safe and healthy educational and employment environment that is free from discrimination, harassment and other misconduct on the basis of sex, which includes sexual orientation, gender-related identity and expression, pregnancy, and other protected characteristics related to sex under federal, state, or local law. The College prohibits all forms of sex-based misconduct, including, but not limited to, sex discrimination, sexual harassment, sexual violence, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking. The College also prohibits discrimination and harassment on the basis of protected characteristics under its under its Non-Discrimination-Students Policy and Equal Employment Opportunity Policy.

It is the policy of the College to comply with Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 ("Title IX"), the Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act ("VAWA"), Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 ("Title VII"), the Illinois Human Rights Act, the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act ("Clery Act"), the Preventing Sexual Violence in Higher Education Act, and all other applicable laws and local ordinances regarding unlawful sex-based discrimination, harassment or other misconduct.

Employees or students found to have engaged in prohibited misconduct will be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including termination and/or expulsion from the College. Contractors, visitors, and any other third parties found to have engaged in prohibited misconduct will be addressed in accordance with the authority of the College in the context of the relationship of the third-party to the College.

#### II. Title IX Compliance

As required under Title IX and its implementing regulations, the College does not discriminate on the basis of sex and prohibits sex discrimination in the education programs and activities that it operates. This requirement not to discriminate extends to admission and employment.

The College has designated the Dean of Students and Executive Director of Human Resources as the Title IX Coordinator(s), who are responsible for coordinating the College's efforts to comply with its responsibilities under Title IX. Inquiries about the application of Title IX and 34 C.F.R. Part 106 may be directed to the College's Title IX. Coordinator(s), the Assistant Secretary for Civil Rights at the United States Department of Education, or both.

Retaliation, including intimidation, threats, coercion, adverse educational or employment actions, or discrimination against any person because they have, in good faith, reported or disclosed alleged discrimination, filed a complaint, or otherwise participated or declined to participate in an investigation into allegations of discrimination, is strictly prohibited.

- Responsibilities of College employees with regard to reporting, forwarding, and/or keeping confidential allegations of discrimination, as applicable;
- The College's response to reports of alleged sex-based misconduct;
- The College's grievance process for complaints alleging Title IX sexual harassment and/or alleging sexual violence, domestic violence, dating violence, or stalking;
- Potential sanctions that may be imposed following the implementation of the College's grievance procedures and limits on those sanctions;
- Prevention and education programming provided to College students; and
- Training and education provided to the Title IX Coordinator(s), Department of
  Human Resources, campus law enforcement, Responsible Employees and
  anyone else involved in the receipt of reports of, responding to,
  investigating or adjudicating alleged incidents of sexual discrimination,
  harassment or other sex-based misconduct, or involved in the referral or
  provision of services to survivors.

#### **Identity Theft Protection**

Rock Valley College Board of Trustees authorizes the Administration to implement an Identity Theft Prevention Program in compliance with the Fair and Accurate Credit Transactions Act of 2003: <u>1</u>6 C.F.R. Part 681 (Federal Trade Commission Rule) and to implement policies to comply with the <u>Safeguards Rule</u>: <u>16 CFR Part 314</u>.

The purpose of this Identity Theft Prevention Program is to detect the warning signs - or "red flags" - of identity theft in our day-to-day operations, take steps to prevent the crime, and mitigate the damage it inflicts. This Program establishes reasonable policies and procedures to facilitate the <u>identification</u>, detection, and response of identity theft in connection with new and established Covered Accounts.

The Federal Trade Commission's Red Flags Rule, apply to greditors, including the College based on the College's offering of institutional loans to students and a plan for payment of tuition, and the Red Flag Rules impose obligation on those creditors that maintain Covered Accounts, specifically the obligation to maintain a written Identity Theft Prevention Program. A Covered Account, under the Red Flags Rule, is basically a consumer account that involves multiple payments or transactions, such as a loan that is billed or payable monthly. The term Covered Account is also other accounts where there is a reasonably foreseeable risk to consumers or the safety and soundness of the credit from identity theft.

The Program applies to the creation, modification and access to Identifying Information of customers to the College. This Program does not replace or repeal any previously existing policies or programs addressing some or all of the activities that are the subject of this Program. This Program acts as a supplement to existing policies and programs.

#### Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act Policy

#### I. Policy Statement

Rock Valley College is committed to maintaining a safe and healthy work environment for all students, employees, and community members. In compliance with the requirements of the federal Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988 and the federal Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act Amendments of 1989, the College has enacted and maintains a drug-free campus policy.

It is the policy of the College that the use, possession, distribution, manufacture, or sale of, or intoxication by illegal drugs, cannabis or its derivatives, controlled substances, unauthorized prescription drugs, or alcoholic beverages (unless authorized as set forth herein) on the premises of any College building or facility, in College-owned vehicles, during work or school hours or while attending any College-related activity is hereby prohibited. Exceptions for alcoholic beverages for special events must be approved by the College's President and in accordance with the Illinois Liquor Control Act of 1934 and any applicable local ordinances.

For purposes of this policy, the terms "controlled substances" or "drugs" shall be defined as the term "controlled substances" is defined in Schedules I through V of Section 202 of the Federal Controlled Substances Act (21 USC § 812).

#### II. Prohibited Conduct

The use, possession, distribution, manufacture, or sale of illegal drugs, cannabis or its derivatives, controlled substances, unauthorized prescription drugs or alcoholic beverages (unless authorized as set forth herein) by students and employees on College property or while participating in any of its activities is prohibited. Faculty, staff, students, and visitors are also prohibited from being under the influence of illegal drugs, cannabis or its derivatives, controlled substances, unauthorized prescription drugs, or alcohol (unless authorized as set forth herein) on the premises of any College building or facility, in College-owned vehicles, while on call, or otherwise during work or school hours, regardless of when and/or where the use occurred.

#### III. Disciplinary Sanctions

Any student or employee who violates this Policy is subject to all applicable Rock Valley College disciplinary sanctions as outlined in the Student Code of Conduct and/or the Employee Handbook. Any community member who violates this Policy will be subject to removal from the College property or event and may be referred to the appropriate law enforcement agency.

#### IV. Drug and Alcohol Abuse Prevention Program

Rock Valley College shall develop and implement a program to educate students and employees on dangers associated with the use of illegal drugs, controlled substances, cannabis and its derivatives, and alcohol. Procedures shall be established to prevent the

#### V. Compassionate Use of Medical Cannabis Program Act

  - Α. Four-inch strip (or width of glass if less than 4 inches wide), from top to bottom, shall be clear of coverings of any type.
  - Remainder of upper glass pane may be covered with posters, curtains, etc., providing the covering is approved by the Divisional Vice President.
- 11. Lower glass pane in two-pane doors: no coverings of any type shall be permitted.
- III. Any variation must allow clear view into an office and must be approved by the Divisional Vice President.

In such cases, the individual must still maintain control of the service animal by means of voice, signal, or other effective controls. Students in need of a service animal on campus must contact Disability Support Services to request and manage their accommodations, including the need for a service animal on campus. Employees in need of a service animal on campus must contact Human Resources to request a reasonable accommodation allowing the presence of a service animal in the workplace. Animals that do not satisfy the above criteria are strictly prohibited from all Rock Valley College property. The College reserves the right to remove and/or exclude any service animal from College property for legitimate and legally permissible public health or safety reasons. In implementing this Policy, Rock Valley, College, complies with the Americans with Formatted Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA), the Americans with Disabilities Amendments Act of 2008 (ADAAA), Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, the Service Animal Access Act/White Cane Law, and all other federal and State laws pertaining to service, animals and/or accommodations for individuals with disabilities. Duties:

The RVC Foundation will:

- Assign one primary contact responsible for the project's fundraising activities
- Work with College President to identify potential donors and community partners
- Explore and identify grant opportunities
- Explore and obtain, with RVC President, necessary approvals for external and internal naming opportunities by the Board of Trustees
- Process and steward all designated campaign gifts (i.e. acknowledgement letters, tax receipts, year-end statements)
- Designate, manage, and award funds received, as outlined within this agreement, for the purpose of athletic scholarship support. Scholarship awards may span multiple years.

The College President or designee will:

- Provide supporting data required for the creation of fundraising materials and grant applications
- Attend campaign planning and progress tracking meetings w/ Foundation staff as needed
- Assist in the securing of prospect meetings when a relationship exists between President and prospect/donor
- Attend donor visits when necessary or critical to the cultivation and solicitation process

Fee:

A Reinvestment Fee of 6.00% will be assessed to all funds donated to the RVC Athletic Turf initiative as part of the Foundation's Reinvestment Fee Policy.

All fee revenue will be collected to reinvest in the Foundation's mission and funds shall be applied to the unrestricted funds line item of the Foundation budget in support of the operational expenses of the RVC Foundation.

Campaign Expenses: All campaign expenses to include, but not limited to: printing of campaign materials, postage, campaign events, and donor naming/signage and stewardship shall be covered by the College. Shall the cost exceed \$10,000, the RVC Foundation will request prior approval by the Board of Trustees.

# Rock Valley College Lease Agreement with OSF Healthcare System Third Amendment

**Background:** 

Rock Valley College (RVC) and OSF Healthcare System (OSF) previously executed a lease agreement on March 17, 2015 ("Lease") for the premises at 3301 N. Mulford Rd., Rockford, Illinois, which includes approximately 32,000 square feet of the building known as the Rock Valley College Health Sciences Center ("HSC"). According to the original lease, the exact square footage would be determined after the building's completion. RVC and OSF have mutually agreed that it is in both parties' best interest to accurately document the as-built conditions and clarify roles and responsibilities for the purpose of monthly billing.

In the First Amendment to the lease executed July 28, 2015, RVC and OSF mutually agreed to hire BLDD/MBA as architect to design and select a contractor through competitive bidding to construct the HSC improvements.

In the Second Amendment to the lease executed October 15, 2019, RVC and OSF agreed on the Commencement Date, the as-built conditions for billing purposes, and that rent and other payments will be based on the actual square footage of 33,661 square feet.

The Third Amendment to the lease will adjust the change in square footage as a result of the installation of a new elevator in the HSC and the need to reconstruct a portion of the OSF fourth floor conference room. As a result of these changes, OSF will now occupy 33,184 square feet, effective July 1, 2025. Any excess payment received from OSF will be credited.

#### THIRD AMENDMENT TO LEASE AGREEMENT

This THIRD AMENDMENT TO LEASE AGREEMENT (this "Lease Amendment 3") is dated as of July 1, 2025 (the "Effective Date"), by and between OSF Healthcare System, an Illinois not-for-profit corporation d/b/a OSF Saint Anthony Medical Center, Rockford f/k/a OSF Saint Anthony Medical Center ("Lessee") and The Board of Trustees of Community College District No. 511, Rockford, Illinois ("Lessor").

#### RECITALS

WHEREAS, Lessor and Lessee have previously entered into a lease executed as of March 17, 2015 (the "Lease") for the Premises at 3301 N. Mulford Rd., Rockford Illinois 61114, consisting of approximately 32,000 square feet of the Building known as the Rock Valley College Health Science Center ("HSC"). Section 1 of the Lease, titled "Lease Premises", states that "[t]he actual square footage shall be determined upon completion of construction of the Building."; and

WHEREAS, Lessor and Lessee previously entered into a First Amendment to the Lease executed July 28, 2015 (the "Lease Amendment 1"). The intent of Lease Amendment 1 was for Lessor and Lessee to mutually agree to hire BLDD/MBA as architect to design and select a contractor through competitive bidding to construct the HSC improvements for both the Lessor and Lessee space in order to simplify and ease administration of design and construction of the HSC; and

WHEREAS, Lessor and Lessee previously entered into a Second Amendment to the Lease executed October 15, 2019 (the "Lease Amendment 2"). The intent of Lease Amendment 2 was for Lessor and Lessee to mutually agree on the Commencement Date, the as-built square footage for purposes of Lessee's rent obligations, the rent and common area maintenance obligations of each party, and the process for annual common area maintenance review and reconciliation; and

**WHEREAS,** Lessor and Lessee mutually agree that the HSC is undergoing remodeling which will involve the installation of an elevator and small elevator lobby that will reduce the Premises (i.e., Lessee's Rentable Area), and the Lease needs further amendment to document the same.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Lease Premises</u>: The Parties agree that the Premises as described in Section 1 of the Lease shall be modified as more fully described on <u>Exhibit A</u>, attached hereto and made a part hereof, and located at 3301 N. Mulford Rd., Rockford Illinois 61114.
- 2. <u>As-Built Conditions for Billing Purposes:</u> Pursuant to Section 3 of the Lease, and more fully described in Section 2 of Lease Amendment 2, Lessee's rent and payments for maintenance, utilities, and janitorial services are based on the square footage of the Premises. The Lessor and Lessee agree that as-built measurements of the HSC for determining rentable area is hereby reduced by 477 S.F. due to the remodeling and are hereby updated as follows:

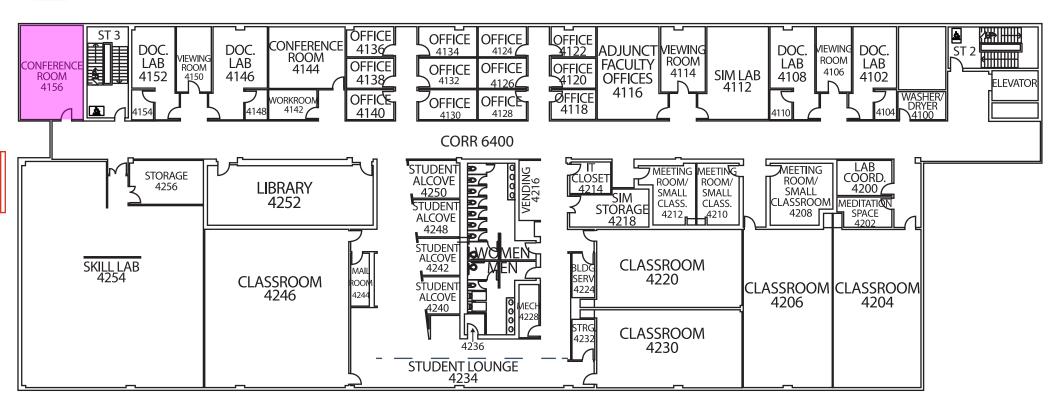

Capitalized terms used herein and not otherwise defined herein shall have the same meanings as ascribed to them in the Lease.
- 4. <u>Binding Agreement</u>. This Lease Amendment 3 shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and their respective successors and assigns and represents the entire understanding between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, and all prior agreements, representations, statements, and understandings between the parties, whether written or oral, are merged into and superseded by this Lease Amendment 3.
- 5. <u>Counterparts.</u> This Lease Amendment 3 may be executed in any number of identical counterparts, with each counterpart having the same effect as if all parties had signed the same document. All executed counterparts will be construed as and constitute the same instrument. A facsimile or electronic copy (e.g., a PDF copy) of an executed counterpart will have the same effect as an original executed counterpart. This document may be executed electronically (e.g., via DocuSign or some similar electronic signature service).

# HEALTH SCIENCES CENTER (HSC) FOURTH FLOOR

#### Fire Tower Intergovernmental Grant Agreement Between Rock Valley College and the City of Loves Park

**Background:** 

Rock Valley College and the City of Loves Park have been working together on the creation of a fire training center for use by the Rock Valley College (RVC) Fire Science program and other local fire departments. This training center, which will be able to conduct live-fire training exercises, will be located next to the Loves Park Fire Station 1, 5170 Rock Valley Parkway, Loves Park, IL 61111.

Rock Valley College has secured two grant awards for the fire training center. The first is an Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) grant for \$500,000. The second is an Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity grant for \$500,000.

The City of Loves Park and Rock Valley College would like to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) that allows the City of Loves Park to perform the necessary site work, including storm drainage, parking lots, curbs, and gutters, using a portion of the ICCB grant. The City of Loves Park would also be responsible for installing the training tower equipment.

RVC would be responsible for purchasing the training tower equipment and coordinating the installation in Loves Park. RVC would be responsible for managing and scheduling all training at the site, with first priority, and the Loves Park Fire Department would have second priority. RVC and the City of Loves Park would also enter into a land lease agreement.

Please refer to the accompanying Fire Tower Lease Intergovernmental Agreement to view the details.

# ROCK VALLEY COLLEGE INTERGOVERNMENTAL GRANT AGREEMENT

This Intergovernmental Grant Agreement (Agreement) is entered into on this **October** \_\_\_\_\_, **2025**, by and between the Board of Trustees of Rock Valley College (herein "College"), and the City of Loves Park, Illinois (herein "City") (collectively "the Parties"), in the exercise of their intergovernmental cooperation powers under the Illinois Constitution of 1970 and the Illinois Intergovernmental Cooperation Act and their respective powers under the Municipal Code and the Public Community College Act.

WHEREAS, College is a community college district comprising Winnebago County, Boone County, and parts of Stephenson, Ogle, McHenry, and DeKalb Counties, and organized pursuant to the Illinois Public Community College Act (110 ILCS 805/1-1, et seq.); and

**WHEREAS**, City is a municipal corporation organized pursuant to the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/1-1, et seq.); and

WHEREAS, the Parties are authorized to enter into intergovernmental agreements for cooperative projects and use agreements in any manner not prohibited by law pursuant to Article VII, § 10 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1, et seq., the Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/1-1, et seq., and the Public Community College Act, 110 ILCS 805/1-1 et seq.; and

**WHEREAS**, the College provides fire science training as one of its educational programs and seeks to purchase a burn tower to conduct additional training; and

**WHEREAS**, City has a fire department with land available for the construction of a burn tower and seeks access to a burn tower for training purposes, and

WHEREAS, the Parties seek to allow other fire departments in the Northern Illinois region to use the burn tower for training purposes; and

WHEREAS, the College will purchase modular equipment specifically designed to construct a burn tower, and will pay the City for site work and for the cost to install the modular equipment in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications; and

**WHEREAS**, the City will be responsible for the site work for the burn tower, and for contracting for the installation of the burn tower; and

**WHEREAS**, the College shall own title of the burn tower and shall have access rights as defined by a ground lease on the City's property; and

**WHEREAS**, the Parties have determined that this collaboration benefits their constituencies, and therefore, it is in their respective best interests and that of their constituencies to enter into this Agreement.

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NOW, THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed by and between the Parties hereto as follows:

- 1. **Incorporation of Preamble Recitals.** The preamble recitals set forth above are incorporated into and made a part of this Agreement.
- 2. **Terms and Conditions**. This Agreement shall incorporate the Terms and Conditions, attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.
  - 1. TERM AND TERMINATION
  - 2, DESCRIPTION OF SUPPLIES AND SERVICES
  - 3. PRICING
  - 4. STANDARD BUSINESS TERMS AND CONDITIONS
  - 5. STANDARD CERTIFICATIONS
- 3. **Scope of Agreement.** The Parties agree that the purpose and scope of this Agreement is for the construction and use of the burn tower on the City's property located at Fire Station No. 1, 5170 Rock Valley Parkway, Loves Park, IL 61111 ("Training Center Site"), as further detailed in **Exhibit B**.
- 4. College's Payments Under this Agreement. The College shall purchase the modified transportation modular equipment needed for the burn tower from a designated fire training tower supplier for a total cost not to exceed \$660,000, which it shall pay directly to the manufacturer of the modulars. The College shall pay the City an amount not to exceed \$300,000 for the City's performance of site work, and \$40,000 for the cost for the delivery of the modulars and installation at the Training Center Site. The College's total contribution for the purchase of the modulars and the costs to the City for the site work, delivery, and installation shall not exceed \$1,000,000, and shall be funded through an ICCB grant and a DCEO grant ("Grants"), a copy of each of which is attached as <a href="Exhibit C">Exhibit C</a>. In the event the College does not receive either of the Grants, the College shall have the right to terminate this Agreement and will have no duty to contribute to any costs for the modular equipment or any other costs under this Agreement.
- 5. City's Duties Under this Agreement. The City shall provide materials and labor to construct a concrete and asphalt pad for the modulars that will be on the Training Center Site. Such work shall include any site work, water main work, or other infrastructure. The City shall also provide for the delivery and installation of the modulars, and shall be reimbursed by the College as set forth in Exhibit A. The City shall also be a sub-grantee of the Grants, and shall comply with all requirements of said Grants. In the event the College does not receive either of the Grants, or in the event that costs exceed the estimates, the City shall have the right to terminate this Agreement and will have no duty to proceed with its obligations under this Agreement.
- 6. Ground Lease and Title to Burn Tower. The Parties shall also enter into a ground lease agreement for the Training Center Site as set forth in <u>Exhibit D</u>. The College shall own title to the burn tower and shall be responsible for all repairs and maintenance of the burn tower, and for insuring the burn tower, as set forth in <u>Exhibit D</u>.
- 7. **Burn Tower Use Agreement and Procedure**. Prior to final completion of the burn tower, the Parties shall work in good faith to create a process and appropriate facility use agreement documents to allow the City and other Northern Illinois fire departments the ability to use the burn tower. The Parties agree that the College fire science training program shall have priority use over the City's fire

department. The College's fire science training program and the City's fire department shall have priority use over other Northern Illinois fire departments. However, the Parties agree that the intent of this intergovernmental agreement is to allow all of the aforementioned parties the opportunity to use the fire tower for training purposes. The Parties agree that the facility use agreements shall contain the following information:

- i. <u>Date of Proposed Training and Use</u>: The date that the City or other Northern Illinois fire department ("Facility User") seeks to use the burn tower, and which shall not interfere with the College or City's use of the burn tower.
- ii. <u>Insurance Requirements</u>: The Facility User shall name the College and the City (for Northern Illinois fire departments) as additional insureds and shall provide a certificate of insurance demonstrating sufficient insurance coverage as determined by the College and City.
- iii. Indemnity: The Facility User shall agree to indemnify the College and the City (for Northern Illinois fire departments) for any claims that arise from the Facility User's use of the burn tower.
- iv. Responsibility for Damage or Loss: The process for securing the burn tower after the Facility User's use of the burn tower. The Facility User shall also be responsible for any damage (aside from any reasonable and expected damage from fire and fire suppression training) to the burn tower, the Training Center Site, any of the College and City's personal property, or any other property that occurs during or is caused by the Facility User's negligence or use of the burn tower. The Facility User shall also be solely responsible for any injuries to any persons, including any wrongful death, that occurs during or is caused by the Facility User's negligence or use of the burn tower.
- v. Maintenance Fee: A reasonable maintenance fee applicable to the Facility User's use of the burn tower to be used to pay for the maintenance of the burn tower and any associated incidental costs attributable to the burn tower.
- 8. **Contact Information**. The Parties contact information for purposes of this Agreement and the Grant is attached hereto as **Exhibit E.**
- 9. **Privileges and Immunity.** Nothing herein shall be construed as an express or implied waiver, relinquishment or release of any common law or statutory privileges and/or immunities of either Party or their Trustees, Board members, elected officials, officers, employees, attorneys, volunteers or agents, including without limitation those privileges and immunities existing under the Local Governmental and Governmental Employees Tort Immunity Act, 745 ILCS 10/1-101, et. seq.
- 10. **Entire Agreement;** No Assignment. This agreement contains all of the terms agreed upon between the Parties. It may not be assigned by either party without the express written consent of the other, and shall be binding upon any successors of the Parties.
- 11. No Third-Party Beneficiaries. This Agreement is entered into solely for the benefit of the College and the City, and nothing in this Agreement is intended, either expressly or impliedly, to provide any right or benefit of any kind whatsoever to any person or entity who is not a party to this Agreement, or to acknowledge, establish or impose any legal duty to any third party. There are no third-party beneficiaries to this Agreement.
- 12. **Severability.** If for any reason any provision of this Agreement is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, that provision shall be deemed severed and the balance of

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the Agreement shall otherwise remain in full force and effect.

- 13. **Governing Law and Venue.** This Agreement shall be governed by, construed, and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois without regard to conflict of law principles. Jurisdiction and venue for all disputes shall be the Circuit Court located in Winnebago County, Illinois.
- 14. **Signature in Counterparts.** This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be an original, but all of which shall constitute one and the same instrument.
- 15. **Effective Date.** This Agreement shall be deemed dated and become effective on the date the last of the Parties signs as set forth below the signature of their duly authorized representatives.

In consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained in this Agreement, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree to the terms and conditions set forth herein and have caused this Agreement to be executed by their duly authorized representatives on the dates shown below.

## EXHIBIT A TERMS AND CONDITIONS

### 1. TERM AND TERMINATION

- 1.1 **TERM OF THIS AGREEMENT:** The Term of this Agreement shall begin with the execution date of this Agreement and expire on the date of substantial completion of the burn tower or the date that the applicable grants are closed out, whichever is later.
- 1.2 **TERMINATION FOR CAUSE:** Either party may terminate this Agreement, in whole or in part, immediately upon notice to the other if: (a) such party determines that the actions or inactions of the other, its agents, employees or subcontractors have caused, or reasonably could cause, jeopardy to health, safety, or property, (b) the other party has notified the terminating party that it is unable or unwilling to perform the Agreement, or (c) the burn tower is not substantially completed by December 31, 2026.

If either party fails to perform to the other party's satisfaction any material requirement of this Agreement, is in violation of a material provision of this Agreement, or the if either party lacks the financial resources to perform the Agreement, the written notice shall be provided to cure the problem identified within the period of time specified in the written notice. If not cured by that date the notifying party may either: (a) immediately terminate the Agreement without additional written notice or (b) enforce the terms and conditions of the Agreement.

For termination due to any of the causes contained in this Section, the parties each retain its right to seek any available legal or equitable remedies and damages.

### 2. **DESCRIPTION OF SUPPLIES AND SERVICES**

- 2.1 **GOAL:** As further described in **Exhibit B** to this agreement, the purpose of this grant program is to establish a training site for current and future firefighters in Northern Illinois. Core components include site preparation, water and electrical upgrades, installation of a concrete pad, purchase of firefighting equipment, construction of a burn tower, and installation of safety features, and all relates services.
- 2.3 **MILESTONES AND DELIVERABLES:** . The City shall substantially complete the site work for the burn tower by October 1, 2026, unless mutually agreed upon by the Parties. The City shall contract for the construction and installation of the burn tower by November 1, 2026, unless mutually agreed upon by the Parties. The Parties shall both meet to inspect the burn tower when the City believes the Work is substantially complete. The Work shall not be considered complete, for purposes of final completion, unless approved by both the College and the City.

### 2.4 **ASSIGNMENT AND SUBCONTRACTING:**

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- 2.4.1 This Agreement may not be assigned, transferred in whole or in part by the City without the prior written consent of the College. Subawards to subrecipients to carry out a part of the grant activities are not authorized without written consent of the award. Subrecipient does not include a beneficiary of the grant program.
- 2.4.2 For purposes of this section, subcontractors are those specifically hired to perform all or part of the work covered by the Agreement.

2.4.3 The City shall provide the names and addresses of all authorized subcontractors to be utilized by the City in the performance of this Agreement, together with a description of the work to be performed by the subcontractor and the anticipated amount of money that each subcontractor is expected to receive pursuant to this Agreement. The City shall follow all rules, regulations, and State of Illinois laws required of the City to perform the services contemplated herein, including but not limited to, procuring the services or material. The City shall provide a copy of any subcontracts to Rock Valley College within 20 days of the approval of contracts or bids by the City. Below is a sample of the information to be provided.

- 2.4.4 The City shall notify the College of any additional or substitute subcontractors hired during the term of this Agreement; the College reserves the right to reject any additional or substitute subcontractors. The City shall provide to the College a copy of all such subcontracts within 20 days of execution of the subcontract.
- 2.4.5 All subcontracts must include the same certifications and terms that the City must make as a condition of this Agreement. The City shall include in each subcontract the subcontractor certifications as shown in Article 5 of this Agreement.
- 2.4.6 The City will be liable as guarantor of any funds it obligates to a subcontractor under this Agreement, in the event that the College determines that the funds were either misspent, or are being improperly held and the subcontractor is insolvent or otherwise fails to return the funds.
- 2.5 **WHERE SERVICES ARE TO BE PERFORMED:** Unless otherwise specified in this section all services shall be performed in the United States. If the City manufactures the supplies or performs the services purchased hereunder in another country in violation of this provision, such action may be deemed by the

College as a breach of the Agreement by the City. City shall disclose the locations where the services required shall be performed and the known or anticipated value of the services to be performed at each location. If the City received additional consideration in the evaluation based on work being performed in the United States, it shall be a breach of Agreement if the City shifts any such work outside the United States.

### 3. **PRICING**

3.1 **METHOD AND RATE OF COMPENSATION:** The College will compensate the City for the initial term as follows:

The College will process payment in the full amount of \$340,000.00 upon execution of this Agreement.

All funds distributed to the City remaining unexpended and unobligated at the end of the grant agreement(s) or at the expiration of the period of time grant funds are available for expenditure or obligation by the City shall be returned to the College within 30 days. The closeout reporting due date is the last date that funds may be expended for obligations made by the expiration date of this agreement.

The City shall not perform services, provide supplies, or incur expenses in an amount exceeding the amount shown in this Section, unless the College has authorized a higher amount in writing prior to the City performing the services, providing the supplies, or incurring the expenses.

Not-to-exceed: **\$340,000.00**.

The City's acceptance of payments certifies that the City agrees to expend funds only for the reasonable, eligible costs related to the services as contemplated herein.

The College shall separately purchase the modulars directly from the burn tower manufacturer in an amount not to exceed \$660,000.00.

Any incidental costs that are not set forth in this Agreement shall be mutually agreed upon between the <u>Parties.</u>

3.4 **PREVAILING WAGES; PAYMENT TERMS AND CONDITIONS**: As a condition of receiving payment the City must (i) be in compliance with the Agreement, (ii) pay its employees prevailing wages when required by law (Examples of prevailing wage categories include public works, printing, janitorial, window washing, building and grounds services, site technician services, natural resource services, security guard and food services. The City is responsible for contacting the Illinois Dept. of Labor 217-782-6206 to ensure understanding of prevailing wage requirements), (iii) pay its suppliers and subcontractors according to the

terms of their respective contracts, (iv) be in compliance with all applicable law, and (v) provide lien waivers to the College upon request, which also include the following certification:

By signing this report [or payment request or both], I certify to the best of my knowledge and belief that the report [or payment request] is true, complete, and accurate; that the expenditures, disbursements and cash receipts are for the purposes and objects set forth in the terms and conditions stated in the grant award; and that supporting documentation has been submitted as required by the grant agreement. I acknowledge that approval for any other expenditure described herein is considered conditional subject to further review and verification in accordance with the monitoring and records retention provisions of the grant agreement. I am aware that any false, fictious, or fraudulent information, or the omission of any material fact, may subject me to criminal, civil or administrative penalties for fraud, false statements, false claims or otherwise. 30 ILCS 708/120.

- 3.5 **INTEREST:** All interest earned on funds held by the City will be treated in accordance with 2 CFR 200.305(b), and the City must remit annually any amount due in accordance with 2 CFR 200.305, as if applicable herein.
- 3.6 **TRANSFER OF COSTS:** Cost transfers, whether as a means to compensate for cost overruns or for other reasons, are unallowable.

### 4. <u>STANDARD BUSINESS TERMS AND CONDITIONS</u>

- 4.0 **SCOPE OF AWARD ACTIVITIES/PURPOSE OF AWARD.** The City must perform as described in this Agreement, including any applicable exhibits. All specific provisions required under this Agreement are described in Section 6 of these Terms and Conditions.
- 4.1 **AVAILABILITY OF APPROPRIATION (30 ILCS 500/20-60):** This Agreement is contingent upon and subject to the availability of funds. The College, at its sole option, may terminate or suspend this Agreement, in whole or in part, without penalty or liability, or further payment being required, if (1) the Illinois General Assembly or the federal funding source fails to make an appropriation sufficient to pay such obligation, or if funds needed are insufficient for any reason, (2) the Governor decreases the Illinois Community Colleges Board's funding by reserving some or all of the Illinois Community Colleges Board's appropriation(s) pursuant to power delegated to the Governor by the Illinois General Assembly; or (3) the Illinois Community Colleges Board's determines, in its sole discretion or as directed by the Office of the Governor, that a reduction is necessary or advisable based upon actual or projected budgetary considerations. City will be notified in writing of the failure of appropriation or of a reduction or decrease.
- 4.2 **AUDIT/RETENTION OF RECORDS (30 ILCS 500/20-65):** The City and its subcontractors shall maintain books and records relating to the performance of the Agreement or subcontract and necessary to support funds disbursed under the Agreement or subcontract. These records must be maintained on a current basis and balanced at least quarterly. Accounting records must be supported by such source documentation as canceled checks, bank statements, invoices, paid bills, letters, time and attendance records, activity reports, and agreements. Books and records, including information stored in databases

or other computer systems, shall be maintained by the City for a period of three years from the later of the date of final payment under the Agreement or completion of the Agreement, and by the subcontractor for a period of three years from the later of final payment under the term or completion of the subcontract. If federal funds are used to pay Agreement costs, the City and its subcontractors must retain its records for five years. Books and records required to be maintained under this section shall be available for review or audit by representatives of the College, the Auditor General, the Executive Inspector General, State of Illinois internal auditors or other governmental entities with monitoring authority, upon reasonable notice and during normal business hours. The City and its subcontractors shall cooperate fully with any such audit and with any investigation conducted by any of these entities. Failure to maintain books and records required by this section shall establish a presumption in favor of the College for the recovery of any funds paid by the College under the Agreement for which adequate books and records are not available to support the purported disbursement. The City or subcontractors shall not impose a charge for audit or examination of the City's books and records.

- 4.3 **TIME IS OF THE ESSENCE:** Time is of the essence with respect to the City's performance of this Agreement. The City shall continue to perform its obligations while any dispute concerning the Agreement is being resolved unless otherwise directed by the College.
- 4.4 **NO WAIVER OF RIGHTS**: Except as specifically waived in writing, failure by a Party to exercise or enforce a right does not waive that Party's right to exercise or enforce that or other rights in the future.
- 4.5 **FORCE MAJEURE:** Failure by either Party to perform its duties and obligations will be excused by unforeseeable circumstances beyond its reasonable control and not due to its negligence including acts of nature, acts of terrorism, riots, labor disputes, fire, flood, explosion, and governmental prohibition. The non-declaring Party may cancel the Agreement without penalty (other than reimbursement of costs as indicated in paragraph 4 of this Agreement) if performance does not resume within 30 days of the declaration.

### 4.6 **RESERVED**

- 4.7 **USE AND OWNERSHIP:** Equipment or supplies created or acquired by the City under this Agreement that are no longer needed for this project shall be used for other activities supported financially by the College. If suitable activities are not identifiable, then the City shall request disposition instructions from the College and abide by written instructions provided by the College, which may be provided in advance of any such request. The College has the right to obtain, reproduce, publish, or otherwise use the data produced under the award and to authorize others to receive, reproduce, publish, or otherwise use such data for College purposes. Confidential data or information contained in such work shall be subject to confidentiality provisions of this Agreement.
- 4.8 **INDEMNIFICATION AND LIABILITY:** The Parties shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless each other, their elected representatives individually, administrators, employees, agents, representatives, and volunteers from any and all claims, demands, causes of action, losses, liens, claims of lien, liabilities, penalties, and damages, including reasonable attorneys' fees and court costs, to the extent arising from any negligent act or omission of the other party, its employees, or its subcontractors, suppliers, and their

employees, and to the extent arising from any breach of this Agreement. The obligations contained in this section shall not be limited by a limitation on amount or type of damages, compensation or benefits payable by or for the other or a subcontractor under the Workers' Compensation Act, or under other workers compensation laws, disability benefit acts, or other employee benefit acts.

- 4.9 **INSURANCE:** The College shall, at all times during the term and any renewals, maintain sufficient insurance to cover the replacement cost of any and all personal property, purchased, or otherwise acquired, in whole or in part, with funds disbursed pursuant to this Agreement.
- 4.10 **GRANT AWARD RECIPIENT:** The City shall act as a grant award recipient and not an agent or employee of, or joint venture with the College. Recipient does not include subrecipients or individuals that are beneficiaries of the award. All payments by the College shall be made on that basis. Neither the City, nor any employee or agent of the City acquires any employment rights with the College by virtue of this Agreement. The City must provide the agreed services and achieve the specified results free from the direction or control of the College as to the means and methods of performance. The City must provide its own equipment and supplies necessary to conduct its business; provided, however, that in the event, for its convenience or otherwise, the College makes any such equipment or supplies available to the City, the City's use of such equipment or supplies provided by the College pursuant to this Agreement is strictly limited to the business contemplated herein and not for any other purpose, including any personal benefit or gain.
- 4.11 **SOLICITATION AND EMPLOYMENT:** The City shall not employ any person employed by the College during the term of this Agreement to perform any work under this Agreement and for a period of one year following the termination of this Agreement. In the event that the City breaches this provision, the City will pay the College, as liquidated damages, an amount equal to 25% of the employee's first year salary with the City.
- 4.12 **COMPLIANCE WITH THE LAW:** The City, its employees, agents, and subcontractors shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, ordinances, regulations, orders, and all license and permit requirements in the performance of this Agreement. The City shall be in compliance with applicable tax requirements and shall be current in payment of such taxes. The City shall obtain at its own expense, all licenses and permissions necessary for the performance of this Agreement.
- 4.13 **RESERVED**:
- 4.14 RESERVED.
- 4.16 **PERFORMANCE RECORD/ SUSPENSION:** Upon request of the College, the City shall meet to discuss performance or provide Agreement performance updates to help ensure proper performance of the Agreement.
- 4.17 **FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT:** This Agreement and all related public records maintained by, provided to or required to be provided to the College and/or City are subject to the Illinois Freedom of Information Act notwithstanding any provision to the contrary that may be found in this Agreement.

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- 4.18 **INTERNAL CONTROL.** The City must maintain effective control and accountability for all cash, real and personal property, and other assets. The City must adequately safeguard all such property and must provide assurance that it is used solely for authorized purposes.
- 4.19 **NOTICE OF CHANGE**: The City must notify the College if there is a change in legal status, FEIN, or address. Further, the City must notify the College in writing, in the event it becomes a party to litigation, investigation, or a transaction that may have a material impact on its ability to perform under this Agreement.
- 4.20 **CONFLICT OF INTEREST**: The City must immediately disclose in writing any potential or actual conflicts of interests to the College.
- 4.21 **EQUIPMENT OR PROPERTY:** Any equipment, material, or real property that the City purchases or improves with funds must not be sold, transferred, encumbered, or otherwise disposed of during the Term without the College's prior approval. The City must obtain disposition instructions from the College when equipment, purchased in whole or in part with funds, is no longer needed for their original purpose. The City must properly maintain, track, use, store and insure the equipment in accordance with applicable best practices, manufacturer's guidelines, federal and state law, and the College's requirements stated herein. The City is responsible for replacing or repairing equipment and materials purchased with funds that are lost, stolen, damaged, or destroyed.
- 4.22 **SEVERABILITY**: If any provision of this Agreement is declared invalid, its other provisions will remain in effect.
- 4.23 **ILLINOIS GRANT FUNDS RECOVERY ACT:** In the event of a conflict between the Illinois Grant Funds Recovery Act and the Grant Accountability and Transparency Act, the provisions of the Grant Accountability and Transparency Act control.
- 4.24 **ATTORNEYS FEES AND COSTS**: Unless prohibited by law, if either party prevails in any proceeding to enforce the terms of this Agreement, including any administrative hearing pursuant to the grant Funds Recovery Act or the Grant Accountability and Transparency Act, the prevailing party has the right to recover reasonable attorneys' fees, costs, and expenses associated with such proceedings.

### 5. **STANDARD CERTIFICATIONS**

The City acknowledges and agrees that compliance with this section and each subsection for the term of the Agreement and any renewals is a material requirement and condition of this Agreement. By executing this Agreement, the City certifies compliance with this section and each subsection and is under a continuing obligation to remain in compliance and report any non-compliance.

This section, and each subsection, also applies to subcontractors used on this Agreement. The City shall include these Standard Certifications in any subcontract used in the performance of the Agreement using the Standard Subcontractor Certification form provided by the College.

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If this Agreement extends over multiple fiscal years including the initial term and all renewals, the City and its subcontractors shall confirm compliance with this section in the manner and format determined by the College by the date specified by the College and in no event later than July 1 of each year that this Agreement remains in effect.

If the Parties determine that any certification in this section is not applicable to this Agreement, it may be stricken without affecting the remaining subsections.

- **5.1** As part of each certification, the City acknowledges and agrees that should the City or its subcontractors provide false information, or fail to be or remain in compliance with the Standard Certification requirements, one or more of the following sanctions will apply:
  - the Agreement may be void by operation of law,
  - the College may void the Agreement, and
  - the City and its subcontractors may be subject to one or more of the following: suspension, debarment, denial of payment, civil fine, or criminal penalty.

Identifying a sanction or failing to identify a sanction in relation to any of the specific certifications does not waive imposition of other sanctions or preclude application of sanctions not specifically identified.

- **5.2** The City certifies it, and its employees will comply with applicable provisions of the U.S. Civil Rights Act, Section 504 of the Federal Rehabilitation Act, the Americans with Disabilities Act (42 U.S.C. § 12101 et seq.) and applicable rules in performance under this Agreement.
- **5.3** The City certifies it is not in default on an educational loan (5 ILCS 385/3). This applies to individuals, sole proprietorships, partnerships and individuals as members of LLCs.
- The City (if an individual, sole proprietor, partner or an individual as member of a LLC) certifies it has not received an (i) an early retirement incentive prior to 1993 under Section 14-108.3 or 16-133.3 of the Illinois Pension Code, 40 ILCS 5/14-108.3 and 40 ILCS 5/16-133.3, or (ii) an early retirement incentive on or after 2002 under Section 14-108.3 or 16-133.3 of the Illinois Pension Code, 40 ILCS 5/14-108.3 and 40 ILCS 5/16-133, (30 ILCS 105/15a).
- 5.5 The City certifies it is a properly formed and existing legal entity (30 ILCS 500/1.15.80, 20-43); and as applicable has obtained an assumed name certificate from the appropriate authority or has registered to conduct business in Illinois and is in good standing with the Illinois Secretary of State.
- 5.6 The City certifies it has not been convicted of bribing or attempting to bribe an officer or employee of the State of Illinois or any other State, nor has the City made an admission of guilt of such conduct that is a matter of record (30 ILCS 500/50-5).
- 5.7 If the City has been convicted of a felony, the City certifies at least five years have passed after the date of completion of the sentence for such felony, unless no person held responsible by a

prosecutor's office for the facts upon which the conviction was based continues to have any involvement with the business (30 ILCS 500/50- 10).

- 5.8 If the City, or any officer, director, partner, or other managerial agent of the City, has been convicted of a felony under the Sarbanes-Oxley Act of 2002, or a Class 3 or Class 2 felony under the Illinois Securities Law of 1953, the City certifies at least five years have passed since the date of the conviction. The City further certifies that it is not barred from being awarded a contract and acknowledges that the College shall declare the Agreement void if this certification is false (30 ILCS 500/50-10.5).
- 5.9 The City certifies it is not barred from having a contract with the College based on violating the prohibition on providing assistance to the College in identifying a need for a contract (except as part of a public request for information process) or by reviewing, drafting or preparing solicitation or similar documents for the State of Illinois (30 ILCS 500/50-10.Se).
- 5.10 The City certifies that it and its affiliates are not delinquent in the payment of any debt to the State of Illinois (or if delinquent, has entered into a deferred payment plan to pay the debt), and the City and its affiliates acknowledge the College may declare the Agreement void if this certification is false (30 ILCS 500/50-11) or if the City or an affiliate later becomes delinquent and has not entered into a deferred payment plan to pay off the debt (30 ILCS 500/50-60).
- **5.11** The City certifies that it and all affiliates shall collect and remit Illinois Use Tax on all sales of tangible personal property to the State of Illinois in accordance with provisions of the Illinois Use Tax Act (30 ILCS 500/50- 12) and acknowledges that failure to comply can result in the Agreement being declared void.
- **5.12** The City certifies that it has not been found by a court or the Pollution Control Board to have committed a willful or knowing violation of the Environmental Protection Act within the last five years and is therefore not barred from being awarded a contract (30 ILCS 500/50-14).
- **5.13** The City certifies it has not paid any money or valuable thing to induce any person to refrain from bidding on a State contract, nor has the City accepted any money or other valuable thing, or acted upon the promise of same, for not bidding on a State contract (30 ILCS 500/50-25).
- 5.14 The City certifies it is not in violation of the "Revolving Door" section of the Illinois Procurement Code (30 ILCS 500/50-30).
- **5.15** The City certifies that it has not retained a person or entity to attempt to influence the outcome of a procurement decision for compensation contingent in whole or in part upon the decision or procurement (30 ILCS 500/50-38).
- **5.16** The City certifies it will report to the Illinois Attorney General and the Chief Procurement Officer any suspected collusion or other anti-competitive practice among any bidders, offerors, contractors, proposers or employees of the College (30 ILCS 500/50-40, 50-45, 50-50).

**5.17** In accordance with the Steel Products Procurement Act, the City certifies steel products used or supplied in the performance of a contract for public works shall be manufactured or produced in the United States, unless the executive head of the procuring agency grants an exception (30 ILCS 565).

- a) If the City employs 25 or more employees and this Agreement is worth more than \$5,000, the City certifies it will provide a drug free workplace pursuant to the Drug Free Workplace Act and that it and its employees will not engage in the unlawful manufacturer, distribution, dispensation, possession, or use of a controlled substance during the performance pursuant to 30 ILCS 580/4.
  - b) If the City is an individual and this Agreement is worth more than \$5,000, the City shall not engage in the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensation, possession or use of a controlled substance during the performance of the Agreement (30 ILCS 580).
- **5.19** The City certifies that neither it nor any substantially owned affiliate is participating or shall participate in an international boycott in violation of the U.S. Export Administration Act of 1979, Anti-Boycott Act of 2018, Part II of the Export Control Reform Act of 2018, or the applicable regulations of the U.S. Department of Commerce. This applies to agreements that exceed \$10,000 (30 ILCS 582).
- **5.20** The City certifies it has not been convicted of the offense of bid rigging or bid rotating or any similar offense of any state or of the United States (720 ILCS 5/33 E-3, E-4).
- **5.21** The City certifies it complies with the Illinois Department of Human Rights Act and rules applicable to public contracts, including equal employment opportunity, refraining from unlawful discrimination, and having written sexual harassment policies (775 ILCS 5/2-105).
- **5.22** The City certifies it does not pay dues to or reimburse or subsidize payments by its employees for any dues or fees to any "discriminatory club" (775 ILCS 25/2).
- 5.23 The City certifies it complies with the State of Illinois Prohibition of Goods from Forced Labor Act, and certifies that no foreign-made equipment, materials, or supplies furnished to the College under the Agreement have been or will be produced in whole or in part by forced labor, or indentured labor under penal sanction (30 ILCS 583).
- 5.24 The City certifies that no foreign-made equipment, materials, or supplies furnished to the College under the Agreement have been produced in whole or in part by the labor or any child under the age of 12 (30 ILCS 584).
- 5.25 The City certifies that it is not in violation of Section 50-14.5 of the Illinois Procurement Code (30 ILCS 500/50-14.5) that states: "Owners of residential buildings who have committed a willful or knowing violation of the Lead Poisoning Prevention Act (410 ILCS 45) are prohibited from doing business with the State of Illinois until the violation is mitigated".
- 5.26 The City warrants and certifies that it and, to the best of its knowledge, its subcontractors have and will comply with Executive Order No. 1 (2007). The Order generally prohibits the City and

subcontractors from hiring the then-serving Governor's family members to lobby procurement activities of the College, or any other unit of government in Illinois including local governments if that procurement may result in a contract valued at over\$25,000. This prohibition also applies to hiring for that same purpose any former State employee who had procurement authority at any time during the one-year period preceding the procurement lobbying activity.

- **5.27** The City certifies that information technology, including electronic information, software, systems and equipment, developed or provided under this Agreement will comply with the applicable requirements of the Illinois Information Technology Accessibility Standards; see https://www.dhs.state.il.us/page.aspx?item=32765. (30 ILCS 587)
- **5.28** The City certifies that for public works projects, as defined in the Illinois Works Job Program Act, the City certifies that it and any contractor(s) or subcontractor(s) that performs work using funds from this Agreement, must, upon reasonable notice, appear before and respond to requests for information from the Illinois Works Review Panel pursuant to 30 ILCS 559/20-25(d).
- **5.29** The City certifies that it complies with all provisions of the federal Internal Revenue Code, the Illinois Income Tax Act (35 ILCS 5/1 *et seq.*), and all regulations and rules promulgated thereunder, including withholding provisions and timely deposits of employee taxes and unemployment insurance taxes.

### **6.0 SPECIFIC PROVISIONS.**

- **6.1** The City must notify the College five (5) days prior to issuing public announcements or press releases concerning work performed pursuant to this Agreement or funded in whole or in part by this Agreement and must cooperate with College in joint or coordinated releases of information.
- **6.2** Each report shall include a forecasted budget of planned expenses by budget category in the approved budget for the forthcoming timeframe (or part thereof) remaining in the Agreement. Final budget modifications must be submitted by September 30 for awards ending December 31<sup>st</sup> or for an award ending on another date, the budget modification must be submitted by 90 days before the end of the term of the agreement.
- **6.3 CITY REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES:** In connection with the execution and delivery of this Agreement, the City makes the following representations and warranties to the College:
  - That it has no public or private interest, direct or indirect, and will not acquire, directly or indirectly
    any such interest which does or may conflict in any manner with the performance of the City's
    services and obligations under this Agreement;
  - 2. That no member of any governing body or any officer, agent or employee of the City, has a personal financial or economic interest directly in this Agreement, or any compensation to be paid hereunder except as may be permitted by applicable statute, regulation or ordinance;
  - 3. That there is no action, suit or proceeding at law or in equity pending, nor to the best of the City's knowledge, threatened, against or affecting the City, before any court or before any governmental or administrative agency, which will have a material adverse effect on the performance required by this Agreement;
  - 4. That to the best of the City's knowledge and belief, the City, its principals and key project personnel:

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- a. Are not presently declared ineligible or voluntarily excluded from contracting with any federal or State department or agency;
- b. Have not, within a three (3)-year period preceding this Agreement, been convicted of any felony; been convicted of a criminal offense in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain, or performing a public (federal, state, or local) transaction or contract under a public transaction; had a civil judgment rendered against them for commission of fraud; been found in violation of federal or state antitrust statutes; or been convicted of embezzlement, theft, larceny, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, making a false statement, or receiving stolen property;
- c. Are not presently indicted for, or otherwise criminally or civilly charged, by a government entity (federal, state or local) with commission of any of the offenses enumerated in subparagraph (ii) of this certification; and
- d. Have not had, within a three (3)-year period preceding this Agreement, any judgment rendered in an administrative, civil or criminal matter against the City, or any entity associated with its principals or key personnel, related to a grant issued by any federal or state agency or a local government.
- 6.4 CITY RESPONSIBILITY: The City will be held responsible for the expenditure of all funds received through this award, whether expended by the City or a subcontractor of the City. The College may seek any remedies against the City for the action of the City or a subcontractor that is not in compliance with applicable statutes and regulations. Further, the City is responsible for ensuring compliance with all applicable laws, rules and regulations, including but not limited to those specifically referenced herein; except where expressly required by applicable law, the College shall not be responsible for monitoring the City's compliance.

### 7.0 PERFORMANCE STANDARDS:

To be stated on the initial submitted periodic performance report, the City will incorporate the following standardized performance measures listed below:

- 1. Did the deliverables specified in the task list submitted pursuant to **Exhibit A** lead to the completion of the project described?
- 2. At the time of the award closeout, has the City fulfilled the public purpose of the project stated in **Exhibit A**?

If the City fails to meet any of the performance measures/goals, and if deemed appropriate at the discretion of the College, the funds may be decreased by an amount proportionate to the size of the shortfall, and/or the City may be responsible for the return of the funds in the amount specified by the College. The College may initiate a grant modification(s) to de-obligate the funds based on the non-performance. The City may submit grant modification requests as necessary in a timely manner, including a request to de-obligate the funds in an amount that the City determines will be unspent by the end of the Agreement.

# EXHIBIT B PROJECT DESCRIPTION - DELIVERABLES OR MILESTONES

### **Project Description:**

Rock Valley College (RVC) is a 2-year community college offering credit and non-credit programs in a variety of fields including fire science. The college district is comprised of Boone and Winnebago counties and portions of Stephenson, Ogle, McHenry, and DeKalb counties. This project will provide a training site for current and future firefighters in Northern Illinois. Core components include site preparation, water and electrical upgrades, installation of a concrete pad, purchase of firefighting equipment, construction of a burn tower, and installation of safety features. A burn tower allows firefighters to practice hose line advancement, search and rescue operations, ventilation, fire suppression tactics, and other firefighting techniques in a controlled environment. The project aligns with the region's need for advanced training facilities to support our local fire departments and emergency responders as evidenced by letters of support from area fire departments. The City of Loves Park also supports construction of a regional fire training center within its city limits. The project partners are confident that the project is shovel ready and can be completed within the identified project period.

The RVC Fire Science program currently does not have a training site that includes a burn tower. The closest burn tower that allows for Class A combustible burning is on West State Street in Rockford and owned by the Rockford Fire Department (RFD). This site hosts a training academy for several months throughout the year so there is not capacity for RVC students and incumbent fire fighters to participate in continuing education. Access to a burn tower allowing for Class A combustible burning is critical for realistic simulation, safety awareness, practical experience, teamwork and communication, confidence building, and exposure to different situations. Loves Park and the surrounding areas have experienced growth in recent years, necessitating a corresponding advancement in emergency response capabilities. By establishing a state-of-the-art fire training facility, regional partners aim to enhance the readiness and effectiveness of firefighters in handling diverse emergency scenarios, ensuring the safety and well-being of community members. The number of firefighter jobs in Boone and Winnebago counties is expected to increase by 5.8% from 2024 to 2029 (Lightcast Q1 2024 Data Set), creating an even greater need for training facilities.

RVC is partnering with the City of Loves Park to build the regional fire training center. The project also has support from the Loves Park Fire Department, South Beloit Fire Department, Belvidere Fire Department, Oregon Fire Protection District, Rockton Fire Protection District, North Park Fire Protection District, and Boone County Fire Protection District 2.

### **Deliverables:**

To be stated on the initial submitted periodic performance report, the City will provide a detailed task list of project deliverables, which must be approved by the College. These tasks and associated due dates, and any subsequent revisions, shall be incorporated by reference into this Agreement. These tasks will be used to measure performance throughout the life of the award and can be updated and reported on each report due date.

### PART ONE - STANDARD TERMS

### 1. TERM AND TERMINATION

- 1.1 TERM OF THIS AGREEMENT: This Agreement has an initial term beginning with the execution date of this agreement (defined as the last date of signature as set forth above) through March 31, 2027. Pre-award expenditures incurred from April 1, 2025 are considered allowable costs as further described in Section 3.1. In no event will the total term of the Agreement, including the initial term, any renewal terms and any extensions, exceed 10 years.
- **1.2 RENEWAL:** Subject to the maximum total term as identified above, the Board has the option to renew for subsequent periods. Any renewal is subject to the same terms and conditions as the original Agreement except as stated in the renewal. This Agreement may not renew automatically nor may the Agreement renew solely at the College's option.
- 1.3 TERMINATION FOR CAUSE: The Board may terminate this Agreement, in whole or in part, immediately upon notice to the College if: (a) the Board determines that the actions or inactions of the College, its agents, employees or subcontractors have caused, or reasonably could cause, jeopardy to health, safety, or property, or (b) the College has notified the Board that it is unable or unwilling to perform the Agreement.

If the College fails to perform to the Board's satisfaction any material requirement of this Agreement, is in violation of a material provision of this Agreement, or the Board determines that the College lacks the financial resources to perform the Agreement, the Board shall provide written notice to the College to cure the problem identified within the period of time specified in the Board's written notice. If not cured by that date the Board may either:

(a) immediately terminate the Agreement without additional written notice or (b) enforce the terms and conditions of the Agreement.

For termination due to any of the causes contained in this Section, the Board retains its rights to seek any available legal or equitable remedies and damages.

**1.4 TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE:** Either Party may, for its convenience and with 30 days prior written notice to the other Party, terminate this Agreement in whole or in part and without payment of any penalty or incurring any further obligation to the other Party. The College shall be entitled to compensation upon submission of invoices and proof of claim for grant activities performed up to and including the date of termination.

## 2. <u>DESCRIPTION OF SUPPLIES AND SERVICES</u>

- 2.1 GOAL: This project will begin development of a fire fighter training site in Northern Illinois for current and future firefighters.
- 2.2 SUPPLIES AND/OR SERVICES REQUIRED: As further described in the Exhibit A, the College will purchase firefighting equipment and modular facilities for construction of a burn tower and work on site preparation for the construction of a burn tower, including, installation of a concrete pad, water and electrical upgrades, and installation of additional safety features.

### 2.3 MILESTONES AND DELIVERABLES:

Working with regional partners, including the City of Loves Park, establish framework and begin to develop a state-of-the-art fire training facility aimed at enhancing the readiness and effectiveness of firefighters in handling diverse emergency scenarios, ensuring the safety and well-being of community members.

### 2.4 ASSIGNMENT AND SUBCONTRACTING:

- 2.4.1 This Agreement may not be assigned, transferred in whole or in part by the College without the prior written consent of the Board. Subawards to subrecipients to carry out a part of the grant activities presented in the grant budget and application are approved; additional subrecipients are not authorized without written consent of the Board. Subrecipient does not include a beneficiary of the grant program.
- 2.4.2 For purposes of this section, subcontractors are those specifically hired to perform all or part of the work covered by the Agreement.
- 2.4.3 Subcontracts for services that will be utilized by the College in the performance of this Agreement presented in the grant budget and application are approved. The College shall provide a copy of any subcontracts within 20 days of request by the Board.
- 2.4.4 The College shall notify the Board of any additional subcontracted services hired during the term of this Agreement. The College shall provide to the Board a copy of all such subcontracts within 20 days of request by the Board.
- 2.4.5 All subcontracts must include the same certifications that the College must make as a condition of this Agreement. The College shall include in each subcontract the subcontractor certifications as shown in Article 5 of this Agreement.
- **2.5 WHERE SERVICES ARE TO BE PERFORMED:** Unless otherwise specified in this section all services shall be performed in the United States. If the College manufactures the supplies or performs the services purchased hereunder in another country in violation of this provision, such action may be deemed by the Board as a breach of the Agreement by the College. College shall disclose the locations where the services required shall be performed and the known or anticipated value of the services to be performed at each location. If the College received additional consideration in the evaluation based on work being performed in the United States, it shall be a breach of Agreement if the College shifts any such work outside the United States.
- **SCHEDULE OF WORK:** Any work performed on State premises shall be done during the hours designated by the Board and performed in a manner that does not interfere with the Board and its personnel.

### 3. PRICING

**3.1 METHOD AND RATE OF COMPENSATION:** The Board will compensate the College <u>for the initial term</u> as follows:

The Board will process payment in the full amount of \$ 500,000.00 upon execution of this Agreement.

Costs incurred after April 1, 2025 and before the execution of the agreement in anticipation of this award are allowable to the extent that they would have been allowable under Section 2.2 if they had been incurred after the execution date of this agreement.

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All funds distributed to the College remaining unexpended and unobligated at the end of the grant agreement or at the expiration of the period of time grant funds are available for expenditure or obligation by the College shall be returned to the State within 45 days. The closeout reporting due date is the last date that funds may be expended for obligations made by the expiration date of this agreement.

The College shall not perform services, provide supplies, or incur expenses in an amount exceeding the amount shown in this Section, unless the Board has authorized a higher amount in writing prior to the College performing the services, providing the supplies, or incurring the expenses.

- **3.3 RENEWAL COMPENSATION:** If this Agreement is renewed, the price shall be at the same rate as for the initial term unless a different compensation or formula for determining the renewal compensation is agreed to by the Parties.
- **3.4 PAYMENT TERMS AND CONDITIONS:** As a condition of receiving payment the College must (i) be in compliance with the Agreement, (ii) pay its employees prevailing wages when required by law (Examples of prevailing wage categories include public works, printing, janitorial, window washing, building and grounds services, site technician services, natural resource services, security guard and food services. The College is responsible for contacting the Illinois Dept. of Labor 217-782-6206 to ensure understanding of prevailing wage requirements), (iii) pay its suppliers and subcontractors according to the terms of their respective contracts, and (iv) provide lien waivers to the Board upon request.

### 4. STANDARD BUSINESS TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 4.1 AVAILABILITY OF APPROPRIATION (30 ILCS 500/20-60): This Agreement is contingent upon and subject to the availability of funds. The Board, at its sole option, may terminate or suspend this Agreement, in whole or in part, without penalty or further payment being required, if (1) the Illinois General Assembly or the federal funding source fails to make an appropriation sufficient to pay such obligation, or if funds needed are insufficient for any reason, (2) the Governor decreases the Department's funding by reserving some or all of the Department's appropriation(s) pursuant to power delegated to the Governor by the Illinois General Assembly; or (3) the Department determines, in its sole discretion or as directed by the Office of the Governor, that a reduction is necessary or advisable based upon actual or projected budgetary considerations. College will be notified in writing of the failure of appropriation or of a reduction or decrease.
- 4.2 AUDIT/RETENTION OF RECORDS (30 ILCS 500/20-65): The College and its subcontractors shall maintain books and records relating to the performance of the Agreement or subcontract and necessary to support funds disbursed under the Agreement or subcontract. Books and records, including information stored in databases or other computer systems, shall be maintained by the College for a period of three years from the later of the date of final payment under the Agreement or completion of the Agreement, and by the subcontractor for a period of three years from the later of final payment under the term or completion of the subcontract. If federal funds are used to pay Agreement costs, the College and its subcontractors must retain its records for five years. Books and records required to be maintained under this section shall be available for review or audit by representatives of:

the Board, the Auditor General, the Executive Inspector General, State of Illinois internal auditors or other governmental entities with monitoring authority, upon reasonable notice and during normal business hours. The College and its subcontractors shall cooperate fully with any such audit and with any investigation conducted by any of these entities. Failure to maintain books and records required by this section shall establish a presumption in favor of the Board for the recovery of any funds paid by the Board under the Agreement for which adequate books and records are not available to support the purported disbursement. The College or subcontractors shall not impose a charge for audit or examination of the College's books and records.

- **4.3 TIME IS OF THE ESSENCE:** Time is of the essence with respect to the College's performance of this Agreement. The College shall continue to perform its obligations while any dispute concerning the Agreement is being resolved unless otherwise directed by the Board.
- **NO WAIVER OF RIGHTS:** Except as specifically waived in writing, failure by a Party to exercise or enforce a right does not waive that Party's right to exercise or enforce that or other rights in the future.
- **4.5 FORCE MAJEURE:** Failure by either Party to perform its duties and obligations will be excused by unforeseeable circumstances beyond its reasonable control and not due to its negligence including acts of nature, acts of terrorism, riots, labor disputes, fire, flood, explosion, and governmental prohibition. The non-declaring Party may cancel the Agreement without penalty if performance does not resume within 30 days of the declaration.
- A.6 CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION: Each Party, including its agents and subcontractors, to this Agreement may have or gain access to confidential data or information owned or maintained by the other Party in the course of carrying out its responsibilities under this Agreement. Each Party shall presume all information received from the other Party or to which it gains access pursuant to this Agreement is confidential. No confidential data collected, maintained, or used in the course of performance of the Agreement shall be disseminated except as authorized by law and with the written consent of the disclosing Party, either during the period of the Agreement or thereafter. The receiving Party must return any and all data collected, maintained, created or used in the course of the performance of the Agreement, in whatever form it is maintained, promptly at the end of the Agreement, or earlier at the request of the disclosing Party, or notify the disclosing Party in writing of its destruction. The foregoing obligations shall not apply to confidential data or information lawfully in the receiving Party's possession prior to its acquisition from the disclosing Party; received in good faith from a third-party not subject to any confidentiality obligation to the disclosing Party; now is or later becomes publicly known through no breach of confidentiality obligation by the receiving Party; or is independently developed by the receiving Party without the use or benefit of the disclosing Party's confidential information.
- 4.7 USE AND OWNERSHIP: Equipment or supplies created or acquired by the College under this Agreement that are no longer needed for this project shall be used for other activities supported financially by the Board. If suitable activities are not identifiable, then the College shall request disposition instructions from the Board and abide by written instructions provided by the Board, which may be provided in advance of any such request. Any intangible property, which includes but is not limited to trademarks, copyrights, patents, original works of authorship, and data, shall vest with the College unless otherwise agreed in writing. The College hereby assigns to the Board rights to reproduce, publish, or otherwise use the work for Board purposes, and to authorize others to do so. The Board has the right to obtain, reproduce, publish, or otherwise use the data produced under the award and to authorize others to receive, reproduce, publish, or otherwise use such data for Board purposes. Confidential data or information contained in such work shall be subject to confidentiality provisions of this Agreement.
- **4.8 INDEMNIFICATION AND LIABILITY:** Neither Party shall be liable for the actions chargeable to the other Party under this Agreement including, but not limited to, the negligent acts and omissions of Party's agents, employees or subcontractors in the performance of their duties as described under this Agreement, unless such

liability is imposed by law. This Agreement shall not be construed as seeking to enlarge or diminish any obligation or duty owed by one Party against the other or against a third party.

- **4.9 INSURANCE:** The College shall, at all times during the term and any renewals, maintain sufficient insurance to cover the replacement cost of any and all real or personal property, or both, purchased, or otherwise acquired, or improved in whole or in part, with funds disbursed pursuant to this Agreement
- **4.10 GRANT AWARD RECIPIENT:** The College shall act as a grant award recipient and not an agent or employee of, or joint venture with the Board. Recipient does not include subrecipients or individuals that are beneficiaries of the award. All payments by the Board shall be made on that basis.
- **4.11 SOLICITATION AND EMPLOYMENT:** The College shall not employ any person employed by the Board during the term of this Agreement to perform any work under this Agreement. The College shall give notice immediately to the Board's director if the College solicits or intends to solicit State employees to perform any work under this Agreement.
- **4.12 COMPLIANCE WITH THE LAW:** The College, its employees, agents, and subcontractors shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, ordinances, regulations, orders, federal circulars and all license and permit requirements in the performance of this Agreement. The College shall be in compliance with applicable tax requirements and shall be current in payment of such taxes. The College shall obtain at its own expense, all licenses and permissions necessary for the performance of this Agreement.
- **4.13 BACKGROUND CHECK:** Whenever the Board deems it reasonably necessary for security reasons, the Board may conduct, at its expense, criminal and driver history background checks of the College's and subcontractors' officers, employees or agents. The College or subcontractor shall reassign immediately any such individual who, in the opinion of the Board, does not pass the background checks.
- 4.14 APPLICABLE LAW: This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with and is subject to the laws and rules of the Board. The Department of Human Rights' Equal Opportunity requirements (44 III. Adm. Code 750) are incorporated by reference. Any claim against the Board arising out of this Agreement must be filed exclusively with the Illinois Court of Claims (705 ILCS 505/1). The Board shall not enter into binding arbitration to resolve any Agreement dispute. The Board does not waive sovereign immunity by entering into this Agreement. The official text of cited statutes is incorporated by reference (An unofficial version can be viewed at <a href="http://www.ilga.gov/legislation/ilcs/ilcs.asp">http://www.ilga.gov/legislation/ilcs/ilcs.asp</a>). In compliance with the Illinois and federal Constitutions, the Illinois Human Rights Act, the U. S. Civil Rights Act, and Section 504 of the federal Rehabilitation Act and other applicable laws and rules the Board does not unlawfully discriminate in employment, contracts, agreements, or any other activity.
- **4.15 ANTI-TRUST ASSIGNMENT:** If the College does not pursue any claim or cause of action it has arising under federal or state antitrust laws relating to the subject matter of the Agreement, then upon request of the Illinois Attorney General, the College shall assign to the Board rights, title and interest in and to the claim or cause of action.
- **4.16 PERFORMANCE RECORD / SUSPENSION:** Upon request of the Board, the College shall meet to discuss performance or provide Agreement performance updates to help ensure proper performance of the Agreement. The Board may consider the College's performance under this Agreement and compliance with law and rule to determine whether to continue the Agreement, suspend the College from doing future business with the Board for a specified period of time, or to determine whether College can be considered responsible on specific future Agreement opportunities.

**4.17 FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT:** This Agreement and all related public records maintained by, provided to or required to be provided to the Board and/or College are subject to the Illinois Freedom of Information Act notwithstanding any provision to the contrary that may be found in this Agreement.

### 5. STANDARD CERTIFICATIONS

The College acknowledges and agrees that compliance with this section and each subsection for the term of the Agreement and any renewals is a material requirement and condition of this Agreement. By executing this Agreement the College certifies compliance with this section and each subsection and is under a continuing obligation to remain in compliance and report any non-compliance.

This section, and each subsection, applies to subcontractors used on this Agreement. The College shall include these Standard Certifications in any subcontract used in the performance of the Agreement using the Standard Subcontractor Certification form provided by the Board.

If this Agreement extends over multiple fiscal years including the initial term and all renewals, the College and its subcontractors shall confirm compliance with this section in the manner and format determined by the Board by the date specified by the Board and in no event later than July 1 of each year that this Agreement remains in effect.

If the Parties determine that any certification in this section is not applicable to this Agreement it may be stricken without affecting the remaining subsections.

- 5.1 As part of each certification, the College acknowledges and agrees that should the College or its subcontractors provide false information, or fail to be or remain in compliance with the Standard Certification requirements, one or more of the following sanctions will apply:
  - the Agreement may be void by operation of law,
  - the Board may void the Agreement, and
  - the College and it subcontractors may be subject to one or more of the following: suspension, debarment, denial of payment, civil fine, or criminal penalty.

Identifying a sanction or failing to identify a sanction in relation to any of the specific certifications does not waive imposition of other sanctions or preclude application of sanctions not specifically identified.

- 5.2 The College certifies it and its employees will comply with applicable provisions of the U.S. Civil Rights Act, Section 504 of the Federal Rehabilitation Act, the Americans with Disabilities Act (42 U.S.C. § 12101 et seq.) and applicable rules in performance under this Agreement.
- 5.3 The College certifies it is not in default on an educational loan (5 ILCS 385/3). This applies to individuals, sole proprietorships, partnerships and individuals as members of LLCs.
- 5.4 The College (if an individual, sole proprietor, partner or an individual as member of a LLC) certifies it has not received an (i) an early retirement incentive prior to 1993 under Section 14-108.3 or 16-133.3 of the Illinois Pension Code, 40 ILCS 5/14-108.3 and 40 ILCS 5/16-133.3, or (ii) an early retirement incentive on or after 2002 under Section 14-108.3 or 16-133.3 of the Illinois Pension Code, 40 ILCS 5/14-108.3 and 40 ILCS 5/16-133, (30 ILCS 105/15a).
- 5.5 The College certifies it is a properly formed and existing legal entity (30 ILCS 500/1.15.80, 20-43); and as applicable has obtained an assumed name certificate from the appropriate authority or has registered to conduct business in Illinois and is in good standing with the Illinois Secretary of State.

5.6 The College certifies it has not been convicted of bribing or attempting to bribe an officer or employee of the State of Illinois or any other State, nor has the College made an admission of guilt of such conduct that is a matter of record (30 ILCS 500/50-5).

- 5.7 If the College has been convicted of a felony, the College certifies at least five years have passed after the date of completion of the sentence for such felony, unless no person held responsible by a prosecutor's office for the facts upon which the conviction was based continues to have any involvement with the business (30 ILCS 500/50-10).
- 5.8 If the College, or any officer, director, partner, or other managerial agent of the College, has been convicted of a felony under the Sarbanes-Oxley Act of 2002, or a Class 3 or Class 2 felony under the Illinois Securities Law of 1953, the College certifies at least five years have passed since the date of the conviction. The College further certifies that it is not barred from being awarded a contract and acknowledges that the Board shall declare the Agreement void if this certification is false (30 ILCS 500/50-10.5).
- 5.9 The College certifies it is not barred from having a contract with the Board based on violating the prohibition on providing assistance to the Board in identifying a need for a contract (except as part of a public request for information process) or by reviewing, drafting or preparing solicitation or similar documents for the State of Illinois (30 ILCS 500/50-10.5e).
- 5.10 The College certifies that it and its affiliates are not delinquent in the payment of any debt to the State of Illinois (or if delinquent, has entered into a deferred payment plan to pay the debt), and the College and its affiliates acknowledge the Board may declare the Agreement void if this certification is false (30 ILCS 500/50-11) or if the College or an affiliate later becomes delinquent and has not entered into a deferred payment plan to pay off the debt (30 ILCS 500/50-60).
- 5.11 The College certifies that it and all affiliates shall collect and remit Illinois Use Tax on all sales of tangible personal property to the State of Illinois in accordance with provisions of the Illinois Use Tax Act (30 ILCS 500/50-12) and acknowledges that failure to comply can result in the Agreement being declared void.
- **5.12** The College certifies that it has not been found by a court or the Pollution Control Board to have committed a willful or knowing violation of the Environmental Protection Act within the last five years and is therefore not barred from being awarded a contract (30 ILCS 500/50-14).
- **5.13** The College certifies it has not paid any money or valuable thing to induce any person to refrain from bidding on a State contract, nor has the College accepted any money or other valuable thing, or acted upon the promise of same, for not bidding on a State contract (30 ILCS 500/50-25).
- **5.14** The College certifies it is not in violation of the "Revolving Door" section of the Illinois Procurement Code (30 ILCS 500/50-30).
- 5.15 The College certifies that it has not retained a person or entity to attempt to influence the outcome of a procurement decision for compensation contingent in whole or in part upon the decision or procurement (30 ILCS 500/50-38).
- **5.16** The College certifies it will report to the Illinois Attorney General and the Chief Procurement Officer any suspected collusion or other anti-competitive practice among any bidders, offerors, contractors, proposers or employees of the Board (30 ILCS 500/50-40, 50-45, 50-50).

- **5.17** In accordance with the Steel Products Procurement Act, the College certifies steel products used or supplied in the performance of a contract for public works shall be manufactured or produced in the United States, unless the executive head of the procuring agency grants an exception (30 ILCS 565).
- a) If the College employs 25 or more employees and this Agreement is worth more than \$5,000, the College certifies it will provide a drug free workplace pursuant to the Drug Free Workplace Act.
  - b) If the College is an individual and this Agreement is worth more than \$5,000, the College shall not engage in the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensation, possession or use of a controlled substance during the performance of the Agreement (30 ILCS 580).
- **5.19** The College certifies that neither it nor any substantially owned affiliate is participating or shall participate in an international boycott in violation of the U.S. Export Administration Act of 1979 or the applicable regulations of the U.S. Department of Commerce. This applies to agreements that exceed \$10,000 (30 ILCS 582).
- 5.20 The College certifies it has not been convicted of the offense of bid rigging or bid rotating or any similar offense of any state or of the United States (720 ILCS 5/33 E-3, E-4).
- **5.21** The College certifies it complies with the Illinois Department of Human Rights Act and rules applicable to public contracts, including equal employment opportunity, refraining from unlawful discrimination, and having written sexual harassment policies (775 ILCS 5/2-105).

- 5.26 The College warrants and certifies that it and, to the best of its knowledge, its subcontractors have and will comply with Executive Order No. 1 (2007). The Order generally prohibits the College and subcontractors from hiring the then-serving Governor's family members to lobby procurement activities of the Board, or any other unit of government in Illinois including local governments if that procurement may result in a contract valued at over \$25,000. # Project Name: Rock Valley College Fire Science Training

### General description of the project and why it is needed:

Rock Valley College (RVC) is a 2-year community college offering credit and non-credit programs in a variety of fields including fire science. The college district is comprised of Boone and Winnebago counties and portions of Stephenson, Ogle, McHenry, and DeKalb counties. This project will provide a training site for current and future firefighters in Northern Illinois. Core components include site preparation, water and electrical upgrades, installation of a concrete pad, purchase of firefighting equipment, construction of a burn tower, and installation of safety features. A burn tower allows firefighters to practice hose line advancement, search and rescue operations, ventilation, fire suppression tactics, and other firefighting techniques in a controlled environment. The project is aligned with the College's Strategic Plan Pillar II: Exceptional Educational Opportunities and Pillar III: Exceptional Training Opportunities. The project also aligns with the region's need for advanced training facilities to support our local fire departments and emergency responders as evidenced by letters of support from area fire departments. The City of Loves Park also supports construction of a regional fire training center within its city limits. The project partners are confident that the project is shovel ready and can be completed within the identified project period.

The RVC Fire Science program currently does not have a training site that includes a burn tower. The closest burn tower that allows for Class A combustible burning is on West State Street in Rockford and owned by the Rockford Fire Department (RFD). This site hosts a training academy for several months throughout the year so there is not capacity for RVC students and incumbent fire fighters to participate in continuing education. Access to a burn tower allowing for Class A combustible burning is critical for realistic simulation, safety awareness, practical experience, teamwork and communication, confidence building, and exposure to different situations. Loves Park and the surrounding areas have experienced growth in recent years, necessitating a corresponding advancement in emergency response capabilities. By establishing a state-of-the-art fire training facility, regional partners aim to enhance the readiness and effectiveness of firefighters in handling diverse emergency scenarios, ensuring the safety and well-being of community members. The number of firefighter jobs in Boone and Winnebago counties is expected to increase by 5.8% from 2024 to 2029 (Lightcast Q1 2024 Data Set), creating an even greater need for training facilities.

RVC is partnering with the City of Loves Park to build the regional fire training center. The project also has support from the Loves Park Fire Department, South Beloit Fire Department, Belvidere Fire Department, Oregon Fire Protection District, Rockton Fire Protection District, North Park Fire Protection District, and Boone County Fire Protection District 2.

The amount requested is \$500,000 with a total cost estimated to be \$1.3 million.

### **GROUND LEASE AGREEMENT**

This Ground Lease Agreement (the "Lease" or "Ground Lease Agreement") is executed on the date last written below, by and between City of Loves Park, an Illinois Municipal Corporation (the "Lessor") and Rock Valley Community College, An Illinois Community College ("Lessee"). The Lessor and Lessee are sometimes referred to individually as a "Party" and together as the "Parties."

### **RECITALS**

- A. The Lessor owns the real property located at 5170 Rock Valley Parkway, Loves Park, IL 61111 (the "Premises"); and
- B. Lessee wishes to erect a burn tower located on the Premises and intends to use the burn tower for its own fire science training program, and to allow the Lessor and other Northern Illinois fire departments the ability to use the burn tower; and
- C. The Parties agree to this Ground Lease Agreement to allow the Lessee to keep its burn tower on the Premises and to govern the Lessee's Use of the Premises.

In consideration of these recitals, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged by each Party, and intending to be legally bound, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Incorporation of Recitals</u>. The recitals set forth above are incorporated into and made a part of this Agreement.
- 2. <u>Description of Premises and Scope of Lease</u>. Lessor leases the Premises, a parcel of land more particularly described on <u>Exhibit A</u>, to Lessee for purposes of installing and operating a burn tower as set forth in the Intergovernmental Grant Agreement between the Parties.
- 3. Rent. The Parties agree that Lessee's capital contribution of \$1,000,000 to build the burn tower that will be located on the Premises, along with its agreement to allow Lessor to use the burn tower for its own fire training, shall constitute the rent for this Lease. Lessee shall not be required to pay any further rent under this Lease.
- 4. <u>Term.</u> The term of this Lease shall commence on upon the date of the last party to sign the Lease below (the "Commencement Date") and shall expire on December 31, 2075, unless sooner terminated in accordance with this Agreement (the "Term" or "Initial Term"). The Lessee shall have the right to renew the lease for one (1) additional twenty-five (25) year term (a "Renewal Term") by providing written notice to Lessor at least thirty (30) days prior to the expiration of the Initial Term. Upon expiration or termination of this Agreement, Lessee shall return the Premises to the Lessor in the same condition, as existed on the Commencement Date, reasonable wear and tear excepted. The Parties agree that Lessee shall be required to remove the burn tower but shall not be required to remove any site work that was performed to allow construction of the burn tower.

- 5. Permitted Uses. The Lessee shall use the Premises solely for Lessee's operation of its fire science training and related educational programs at the burn tower. Lessee shall not use or permit the use of the Premises for any other purpose without the written consent of the Lessor, which may not be unreasonably withheld. The Parties agree that the Lessor and thirdparty fire departments may use the burn tower for training purposes upon written approval of the Lessee which shall not be unreasonably withheld. The Lessee shall approve the Lessor and thirdparty fire departments' use of the burn tower in a reasonable time upon Lessor and the fire departments' request. Lessee shall have priority use of the burn tower and Lessee shall have the right to deny Lessor or fire department requests to use the burn tower if the proposed dates and times of use would unreasonably interfere with the Lessee's use of the burn tower. The Lessee and Lessor shall work together in good faith to establish a process to document Lessor and thirdparty fire departments' use of the burn tower, including the costs for the third-party fire departments to use the burn tower. Lessee agrees that its use and operation of the burn tower (including use by permitted users), shall not unreasonably interfere with or impede City's fire department operations.
- 6. <u>Utilities</u>. Lessor shall be responsible for maintaining and paying for electricity, gas, water, and sewer utilities for the Premises.
- 7. Insurance. Each Party shall procure and maintain through an insurance company or self insurance, the coverage and limits as specified below, and by endorsement shall cause the other to be named as an additional insured on such policies. This additional insured requirement does not apply to workers' compensation insurance. The commercial general liability and automobile liability policies shall be endorsed to reflect that coverage is primary to and noncontributory with any other insurance available to the Party. The commercial general liability policy shall by endorsement provide contractual liability coverage including the indemnity obligations provided in this Lease. Each such policy shall include by endorsement a requirement of at least 30 days written notice to the other Party prior to any termination, cancellation or material amendment to that policy. Upon execution of this Lease and on an annual basis thereafter during the Term of this Lease or any extension thereof, the Parties shall furnish to the Lessor certificate(s) of insurance, policies, and endorsements reflecting the required coverages. The type and minimum limits of insurance required are as follows:

Lessee shall have sole responsibility to insure the burn tower and other personal property owned by Lessee located upon the Premises.

- 8. <u>Indemnity</u>. To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Parties shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the other Party, its Board, the Board's individual members, its directors, officers, administrators, employees, agents, insurers, and representatives from and against any and all claims, demands, causes of action, losses, expenses, liabilities, judgments, and damages, including reasonable attorneys' fees and court costs, to the extent resulting directly from any breach of this Lease by the Indemnifying Party and/or any negligent act or omission of the Indemnifying Party, its employees, or agents, except to the extent caused by the negligence or willful misconduct of the Indemnifying Party. This section shall survive the expiration or termination of this Lease. Notwithstanding the foregoing, neither party waives any statutory immunities to which it may avail itself.
- 9. Repairs and Maintenance. Lessee shall keep the burn tower in good repair during the Term, and shall provide and pay for any repair or maintenance that becomes necessary for the use of the burn tower. Lessee shall also reasonably keep the parking lot clean and pickup debris arising from Lessee's use of the burn tower. If the nature of the breach is such that it cannot be cured within said sixty (60) day period, the breaching Party shall be deemed to have cured same if within said sixty (60) day period it commences and diligently pursues such cure and thereafter completes same within such time as is reasonable under the circumstances.
- 13. **Assignment, Sublet.** This Agreement may not be assigned or sublet without the prior written consent of the Lessor, which shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- 14. **Destruction of Burn Tower and Replacement.** In the event the burn tower is destroyed or otherwise reaches the end of its useful life, the Lessee shall have the right to replace the burn tower on the Premises so long as within the Term or a Renewal Term of this Lease. However, Lessee shall have no obligation to replace the burn tower and instead Lessee may terminate this Agreement upon written notice to the Lessor.

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### **Fire Tower Ground Lease Agreement** Between Rock Valley College and the City of Loves Park

### **Background:**

Rock Valley College and the City of Loves Park have been working together on the creation of a fire training center for use by the Rock Valley College (RVC) Fire Science program and other local fire departments. This training center, which will be able to conduct live-fire training exercises, will be located next to the Loves Park Fire Station 1, 5170 Rock Valley Parkway, Loves Park, IL 61111.

Rock Valley College has secured two grant awards for the fire training center. The first is an Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) grant for \$500,000. The second is an Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity grant for \$500,000.

The City of Loves Park and Rock Valley College entered into an Intergovernmental Grant Agreement (IGA) that allows the City of Loves Park and RVC to construct a burn tower. In addition, a ground lease agreement between the City of Loves Park and RVC will allow the City of Loves Park to lease the property to RVC for 50 years, with one 25-year extension. Said lease will expire on December 31, 2075.

RVC's capital contribution of \$1,000,000 to build the burn tower located on land owned by the City of Loves Park, along with its agreement to allow the City of Loves Park to use the burn tower for its own fire training, shall constitute the rent for the lease.

Both parties agree to maintain proper insurance. RVC shall keep the burn tower in good repair during the term of the lease, and shall provide and pay for any repair or maintenance that becomes necessary for the use of the burn tower. RVC shall also reasonably keep the parking lot clean and pick up debris arising from use of the burn tower. The City of Loves Park shall be responsible for and shall provide snow removal services, mowing, parking lot repairs, and landscape services on the property. Both parties agree that if the parking lot needs to be replaced or reconstructed, the parties will split the cost.

Please refer to the accompanying Fire Tower Ground Lease Agreement to view the details.

### **GROUND LEASE AGREEMENT**

This Ground Lease Agreement (the "Lease" or "Ground Lease Agreement") is executed on the date last written below, by and between City of Loves Park, an Illinois Municipal Corporation (the "Lessor") and Rock Valley Community College, An Illinois Community College ("Lessee"). The Lessor and Lessee are sometimes referred to individually as a "Party" and together as the "Parties."

### **RECITALS**

- A. The Lessor owns the real property located at 5170 Rock Valley Parkway, Loves Park, IL 61111 (the "Premises"); and
- B. Lessee wishes to erect a burn tower located on the Premises and intends to use the burn tower for its own fire science training program, and to allow the Lessor and other Northern Illinois fire departments the ability to use the burn tower; and
- C. The Parties agree to this Ground Lease Agreement to allow the Lessee to keep its burn tower on the Premises and to govern the Lessee's Use of the Premises.

In consideration of these recitals, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged by each Party, and intending to be legally bound, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Incorporation of Recitals</u>. The recitals set forth above are incorporated into and made a part of this Agreement.
- 2. <u>Description of Premises and Scope of Lease</u>. Lessor leases the Premises, a parcel of land more particularly described on <u>Exhibit A</u>, to Lessee for purposes of installing and operating a burn tower as set forth in the Intergovernmental Grant Agreement between the Parties.
- 3. Rent. The Parties agree that Lessee's capital contribution of \$1,000,000 to build the burn tower that will be located on the Premises, along with its agreement to allow Lessor to use the burn tower for its own fire training, shall constitute the rent for this Lease. Lessee shall not be required to pay any further rent under this Lease.
- 4. <u>Term.</u> The term of this Lease shall commence on upon the date of the last party to sign the Lease below (the "Commencement Date") and shall expire on December 31, 2075, unless sooner terminated in accordance with this Agreement (the "Term" or "Initial Term"). The Lessee shall have the right to renew the lease for one (1) additional twenty-five (25) year term (a "Renewal Term") by providing written notice to Lessor at least thirty (30) days prior to the expiration of the Initial Term. Upon expiration or termination of this Agreement, Lessee shall return the Premises to the Lessor in the same condition, as existed on the Commencement Date, reasonable wear and tear excepted. The Parties agree that Lessee shall be required to remove the burn tower but shall not be required to remove any site work that was performed to allow construction of the burn tower.

The Lessee and Lessor shall work together in good faith to establish a process to document Lessor and third-party fire departments' use of the burn tower, including the costs for the third-party fire departments to use the burn tower. Lessee agrees that its use and operation of the burn tower (including use by permitted users), shall not unreasonably interfere with or impede City's fire department operations.
- 6. <u>Utilities</u>. Lessor shall be responsible for maintaining and paying for electricity, gas, water, and sewer utilities for the Premises.

This section shall survive the expiration or termination of this Lease. Notwithstanding the foregoing, neither party waives any statutory immunities to which it may avail itself.

To the Board of Trustees, the Chair, and President Dr. Spearman,

I'm pleased to submit my Student Trustee Report for October 28, 2025, covering my attendance at the Illinois Community College Student Activities Association (ICCSAA) conference held at Illinois Central College on October 10-11, 2025, as well as recent student organization activities on campus.

## \*\*ICCSAA Conference Report\*\*

ICCSAA is a statewide organization that brings together student leaders from Illinois community colleges to develop leadership skills, network with peers, and learn best practices for student engagement. This year's conference, themed "Leading Illinois Together," was hosted at Illinois Central College in Peoria and brought together student leaders from across the state, including members from Student Government Association (SGA), Campus Activities Board (CAB), and Phi Theta Kappa (PTK) from Rock Valley College.

#### \*Day 1 - Conference Opening and Leadership Development\*

The conference kicked off with a welcome from Illinois Central College President Dr. Dr. Sheila Quirk-Bailey, who spoke about how community college students redefine success by balancing classes, jobs, families, and community commitments while still finding time to lead and serve others. Her message really resonated with me because it captured what so many of our students are going through.

We also heard from Dr. Luevinus Muhammad, who got everyone energized with an interactive introduction where the whole room participated in call-and-response. The energy in that room was incredible - you could feel everyone's excitement about being there.

One of the highlights was a presentation by a professional mentalist who demonstrated body language reading and communication skills. While it was entertaining, the real value was learning about leadership principles like:

- Leadership is ordinary it's about stepping forward and accepting responsibility
- Leadership is process building confidence through consistent effort, not just outcomes
- Leadership starts with you being responsible for the energy you bring into a room
- Leadership is community having celebrators, mentors, and accountability partners

The presentation included practical body language skills we can use when communicating with students and leading organizations. We learned about proximity, orientation, pacifiers, and open vs. closed body language - all things that help us better connect with and understand the people we're leading.

After dinner, there were fellowship activities including karaoke and bingo. Someone from our table actually won bingo, which was exciting! These informal activities were just as valuable as

the formal sessions because they gave us time to connect with student leaders from other colleges and learn what's working on their campuses.

Many of us from SGA, CAB, and PTK stayed at the Embassy Suites that night, which gave us more time to debrief about what we were learning and how we could apply it at Rock Valley College.

## \*Day 2 - Continued Programming and Networking\*

The second day featured additional presentations and breakout sessions. We participated in a t-shirt signing activity where we collected signatures from students at different colleges throughout the day. It was a fun way to make sure we were actually meeting people and building connections rather than just sitting in sessions.

There was also information shared about opportunities to design the logo for next year's conference, which shows how ICCSAA values student creativity and involvement in shaping the organization.

We took a group photo with all attendees and then broke into different presentation sessions where we could choose topics that interested us most.

\*Connections with Other Student Trustees\*

One of the most valuable parts of the conference for me personally was getting to talk with student trustees from other community colleges. It was really helpful to hear their perspectives on what's working at their colleges, what challenges they're facing, and how they're approaching their role. These connections give me a network of peers I can reach out to for advice and collaboration throughout the year.

\*Key Takeaways from the Conference\*

This conference gave me several concrete things I want to bring back to Rock Valley:

- 1. \*\*Better communication skills\*\* The body language training will help me have more effective conversations when gathering student feedback and representing diverse perspectives to the Board.
- 2. \*\*Leadership development ideas\*\* The presentation on leadership principles reminded me that leadership is about process and community, not perfection. This is something I can share with student leaders in our organizations who might be feeling overwhelmed.
- 3. \*\*Networking best practices\*\* The structured networking activities showed me new ways we could help students at Rock Valley connect with each other, especially students who might not naturally put themselves out there.

4. \*\*Statewide connections\*\* - Having relationships with student leaders and trustees from other Illinois community colleges gives me resources and ideas I can bring back to benefit our students.

Attending this conference reminded me of the importance of investing in leadership development. The fact that students from across Illinois took time to come together, learn from each other, and develop their skills shows the commitment that community college students have to making their campuses better places. I'm grateful for the opportunity to represent Rock Valley College at this conference and to learn alongside student leaders from our own campus and from colleges across the state.
